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## EMPLOYMENT COST INDEX - MARCH 1992

The Employment Cost Index (ECI) increased 1.2 percent before seasonal adjustment in the 3 months ended in March 1992, the U.S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. The March 1992 ECI level of 113.5 (June 1989=100) was 4.0 percent higher than the index in March 1991. The ECI measures changes in compensation costs, including wages, salaries, and employer costs for employee benefits.

### Quarterly changes, seasonally adjusted

On a seasonally adjusted basis, ECI compensation costs rose 0.9 percent in the December 1991-March 1992 quarter, the same as in the September-December 1991 quarter. (See table below.) Corresponding quarterly increases in wages and salaries were 0.7 and 0.9 percent. Benefit costs rose 1.3 percent in December 1991-March 1992, following a 1.2 percent increase in September-December 1991, their smallest quarterly rise since 1987.

### Over-the-year changes, unadjusted

Compensation costs (not seasonally adjusted) increased 4.0 percent for the year ended in March 1992--down from 4.3 percent for the year ended December 1991. (See table 4.) This pattern held for both private industry workers (4.2 percent, down from 4.4 percent) and state and local government workers (3.0 percent, down from 3.6 percent).

The slowdown in the rate of compensation growth reflected a deceleration in wage and salary gains (3.2 percent, down from 3.6 percent for the year ended December 1991). Lower wage and salary increases were recorded for both private industry workers (3.4 percent, down from 3.7 percent) and state and local government workers (2.9 percent, down from 3.5 percent).

In contrast to the deceleration in wage and salary gains, benefit cost increases were about the same in March 1991-92 as in December 1990-91--5.7 percent and 5.6 percent, respectively. This leveling off in benefit cost increases persisted for private industry workers (6.3 percent and 6.2 percent, respectively), but not for state and local government workers (3.4 percent, down from 3.9 percent). Health and workers' compensation insurance continued their relatively rapid rises, with the increases in private industry exceeding those in state and local governments.

Compensation increases in private industry for the year ended in March 1992 were higher for service occupations (4.8 percent) than for blue-collar (4.3 percent) or white-collar occupations (4.0 percent), reflecting in part the effects of the April 1, 1991, increase in the Federal minimum wage from \$3.80 to \$4.25 an hour. Compensation gains for white-collar occupational groups ranged from 3.3 percent for sales workers to 4.7 percent for professional and technical workers. Increases for blue-collar workers varied from 3.9 percent for precision production, craft, and repair occupations and for transportation and material moving occupations to 5.2 percent for machine operators, assemblers, and inspectors. (See table 5.)

Over-the-year compensation gains were higher for private goods-producing industries (4.6 percent) than for service-producing industries (4.0 percent). Within the service-producing industries, compensation increases ranged from 2.0 percent in business services to 5.5 percent in communications. Compensation gains among the goods-producing industries ranged from 3.0 percent in construction to 5.2 percent in durable goods manufacturing.

Compensation increases for union workers (5.2 percent) exceeded those for nonunion workers (4.0 percent) for the year ended in March 1992, as they have since June 1991 and in contrast to the trend that had prevailed for nearly a decade. This pattern held for both service-producing and goods-producing industries. (See table 6.)

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ECI data for June 1992 will be released on Tuesday, July 28, 1992, at 8:30 A.M. (EDT).



EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Employment Cost Index (ECI) is a measure of the change in the cost of labor, free from the influence of employment shifts among occupations and industries. The compensation series includes changes in wages and salaries and employer costs for employee benefits. The wage and salary series and the benefit cost series provide the change for the two components of compensation.

Wages and salaries are defined as the hourly straight-time wage rate or, for workers not paid on an hourly basis, straight-time earnings divided by the corresponding hours. Straight-time wage and salary rates are total earnings before payroll deductions, excluding premium pay for overtime and for work on weekends and holidays, shift differentials, and nonproduction bonuses such as lump-sum payments provided in lieu of wage increases. Production bonuses, incentive earnings, commission payments, and cost-of-living adjustments are included in straight-time wage and salary rates.

Benefits covered by the ECI are: Paid leave (vacations, holidays, sick leave, and other leave); supplemental pay (premium pay for overtime, shift differentials, and nonproduction bonuses such as lump-sum payments provided in lieu of wage increases); insurance benefits (life, health, and sickness and accident); retirement and savings benefits (pension and other retirement plans and savings and thrift plans); legally required benefits (social security, railroad retirement and supplemental retirement, railroad unemployment insurance, Federal and state unemployment insurance, workers' compensation, and other legally required benefits such as state temporary disability); and other benefits (severance pay and supplemental unemployment plans).

The ECI provides data for the civilian economy, which includes the total private economy and the public sector--excluding farms, households, and the Federal government. The private industry series and the State and local government series provide data for the two sectors separately.

Each quarter, straight-time average hourly wage and salary rates and benefit cost data (cents-per-hour-worked) are collected from a probability sample of over 23,000 occupations within over 4,500 sample establishments in private industry and about 7,000 occupations within 1,000 sample establishments in state and local governments. Data are collected for the pay period including the 12th day of the survey months of March, June, September, and December.

The sample establishments are classified in industry categories based on the 1987 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC), as defined by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget.

Within an establishment, specific job categories are selected to represent broader occupational definitions. Since June 1986, the jobs have been classified according to definitions used in the 1980 Census. Prior to June 1986, they were classified according to the 1970 Census. Differences between the two classification systems are slight, as indicated in the article "Introducing new weights for the Employment Cost Index," in the June 1985 issue of the Monthly Labor Review.

Fixed employment weights are used each quarter to calculate the most aggregate indexes--civilian, private, and state and local governments. These

fixed weights are also used to derive all of the industry and occupation series indexes. Since June 1986, employment counts from the 1980 Census have been used as weights. Prior to June 1986, employment counts from the 1970 Census were used.

For the series based on bargaining status, region, or area size, employment data are not available from the Census. The employment weights are reallocated within these series each quarter based on the current ECI sample. The indexes for these series, consequently, are not strictly comparable to those for the aggregate, industry, and occupation series. A fuller explanation of the calculation of index numbers appears in an article, "Estimation procedures for the Employment Cost Index," in the May 1982 issue of the Monthly Labor Review.

Beginning with the March 1990 ECI release, indexes were rebased to June 1989=100. A description of the rebasing is included in the article "Employment Cost Index Rebased to June 1989," in the April 1990 issue of the Monthly Labor Review.

Beginning with the December 1990 ECI release, seasonally adjusted data are available for selected ECI series. Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a more or less regular pattern each year. These adjustments make nonseasonal patterns easier to spot.

The costs per hour worked of compensation components, based on March 1991 data from the ECI, are published in a separate news release titled "Employer Costs for Employee Compensation - March 1991."<sup>1</sup> A description of the cost levels is provided in the article "Analyzing employers' costs for wages, salaries, and benefits" in the October 1987 issue of the Monthly Labor Review. The cost levels, which are published annually in mid-June, are calculated with current employment weights, rather than the fixed 1980 Census weights used in computing the ECI. Therefore, year-to-year changes in the cost levels will usually differ from those in the ECI.

More detailed information on the ECI is available in several sources. These include an annual bulletin, Employment Cost Indexes and Levels, 1975-91, (Bulletin 2389); a chapter in the BLS Handbook of Methods (Bulletin 2285), "The Employment Cost Index;" and several articles published in the Monthly Labor Review.
