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
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EMPLOYMENT COST INDEX – MARCH 2016

Compensation costs for civilian workers increased 0.6 percent, seasonally adjusted, for the 3-month period ending in March 2016, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. Wages and salaries (which make up about 70 percent of compensation costs) increased 0.7 percent, and benefits (which make up the remaining 30 percent of compensation) increased 0.5 percent. Civilian Workers


Compensation costs for civilian workers increased 1.9 percent for the 12-month period ending in March 2016. In March 2015, compensation costs increased 2.6 percent. Wages and salaries increased 2.0 percent for the current 12-month period, and increased 2.6 percent for the 12-month period ending in March 2015. Benefit costs increased 1.7 percent for the 12-month period ending in March 2016. In March 2015, the increase was 2.7 percent. (See chart 2 and tables A, 4, 8, and 12.)

Private Industry Workers

Compensation costs for private industry workers increased 1.8 percent over the year, lower than the March 2015 increase of 2.8 percent. **Wages and salaries** increased 2.0 percent for the current 12-month period. In March 2015, the increase was 2.8 percent. The increase in the cost of **benefits** was 1.2 percent for the 12-month period ending in March 2016, significantly lower than March 2015 when the increase was 2.6 percent. Employer costs for **health benefits** increased 3.3 percent for the 12-month period ending in March 2016, and increased 2.5 percent in March 2015. (For further information, see www.bls.gov/web/eci/echealth.pdf.)


Among **occupational groups**, compensation cost increases for private industry workers for the 12-month period ending in March 2016 ranged from 1.4 percent for sales and office occupations to 2.5 percent for production, transportation, and material moving occupations. (See table 5.)

Among **industry supersectors**, compensation cost changes for private industry workers for the current 12-month period ranged from -1.7 percent for information to +2.8 percent for trade, transportation and utilities. (See table 5.)

State and Local Government Workers

Compensation costs for state and local government workers increased 2.4 percent for the 12-month period ending in March 2016. In March 2015, the increase was 2.1 percent. Wages and salaries increased 1.8 percent for the 12-month period ending in March 2016, the same increase as the 12-month period ending in March 2015. Benefit costs increased 3.5 percent for the 12-month period ending in March 2016, a higher rate than in the prior year when the increase was 2.8 percent. (See chart 5 and tables A, 7, 11, and 12.)

TECHNICAL NOTE

The Employment Cost Index (ECI) measures the change in the cost of labor, free from the influence of employment shifts among occupations and industries. Detailed information on survey concepts, coverage, methods, nonresponse adjustment, and imputation can be found in *BLS Handbook of Methods*, Chapter 8, "National Compensation Measures," Bureau of Labor Statistics, on the Internet at www.bls.gov/opub/hom/pdf/homch8.pdf.

Sample size

Data for the March 2016 reference period were collected from a probability sample of approximately 28,900 occupational observations selected from a sample of about 6,900 private industry establishments and approximately 8,800 occupational observations selected from a sample of about 1,500 state and local government establishments that provided data at the initial interview.

Standard Errors

To assist users in ascertaining the reliability of Employment Cost Index (ECI) series, standard errors of all current quarter estimates except seasonally adjusted series are made available shortly after publication of the news release. Standard errors provide users a measure of the precision of an estimate to ensure that it is within an acceptable range for their intended purpose. This listing uses the Standard Industrial Classification Manual and Census of Population series through 2005 and the North American Industry Classification System and Standard Occupational Classification from 2006 to the present. It provides the official series from the beginning of the ECI in 1975 through the current quarter. Employer Costs for Employee Compensation data

The costs per hour worked of compensation components, based on data from the ECI, are published in a separate news release titled "Employer Costs for Employee Compensation" (ECEC). Since the ECEC is calculated with current employment weights rather than the fixed weights used in computing the ECI, year-to-year changes in the cost levels usually differ from those in the ECI.
