




Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector








Over-the-year change in the <u>prices paid by urban</u> <u>consumers</u> for selected categories




12-month percent change in CPI-U, March 2024






Average annual spending and percent distribution for selected categories


<u>Employer costs</u> per hour worked for wages and selected employee benefits by geographic division
