

Columbia, SC, Area Economic Summary


Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector






Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories






Average annual spending and percent distribution for selected categories

Average hourly wages for selected occupations


