$\square$ 2005-06 survey
$\square$ Quarterly data, annualized
$\square 15,150$ households with children (weighted data)
$\square$ Expenditures updated each year with Consumer Price Index

## Expenditure Data

## $\square$ Child-specific-clothing, child care, and education

$\square$ Household level-housing, food,* transportation, health care,* and miscellaneous goods
*Other studies show family member shares.

$\square 2005$ Medical Expenditure Panel Survey

## To Determine Housing Expenditures

$\square$ Allocated to a child based on housing expenses associated with an additional bedroom in a home
$\square$ Includes additional costs due to utilities and furniture

## To Determine Transportation and Miscellaneous Expenditures

$\square$ Only examine family-related transportation, which accounts for 59\% of total transportation (2001 National Household Travel Survey)
$\square$ Per Capita Method

## Concerns

$\square$ Annualizing quarterly data versus linking data
$\square$ Food and health care expenditures lower than similar expenditures in other data sets
$\square$ Adequacy of state-level data

## Recommendations

$\square$ Maintain child-specific expenditure data (clothing, child care, and education)
$\square$ Add more child-specific expenditure data (health care, miscellaneous items)
$\square$ Examine expenditures on children made by non-household members
$\square$ Ask parents percent of housing expenditures going to children
