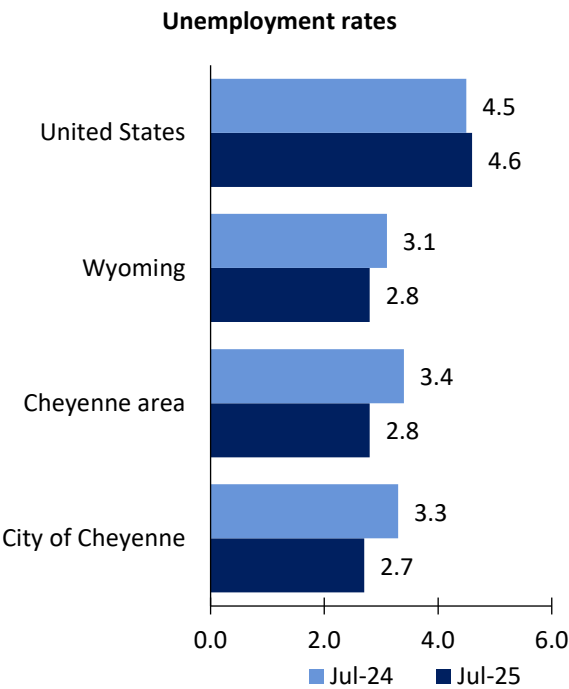


Cheyenne Area Economic Summary

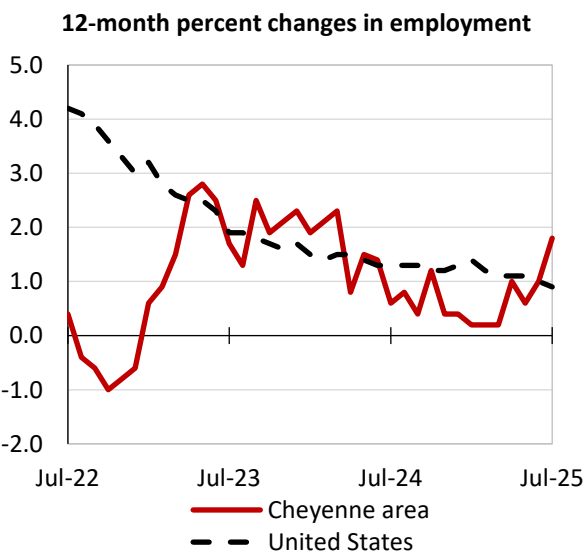
Average weekly wages for all industries by county

Employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector, over-the-year changes

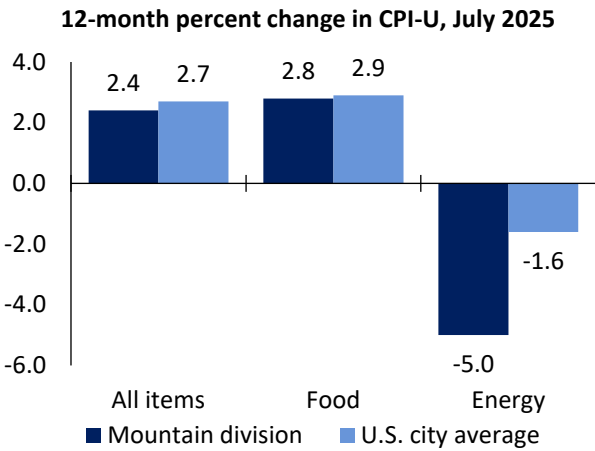

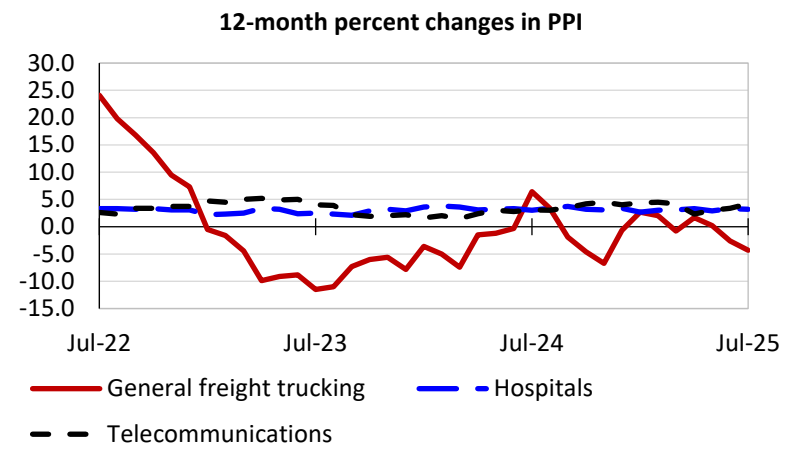


Prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories, over-the-year change



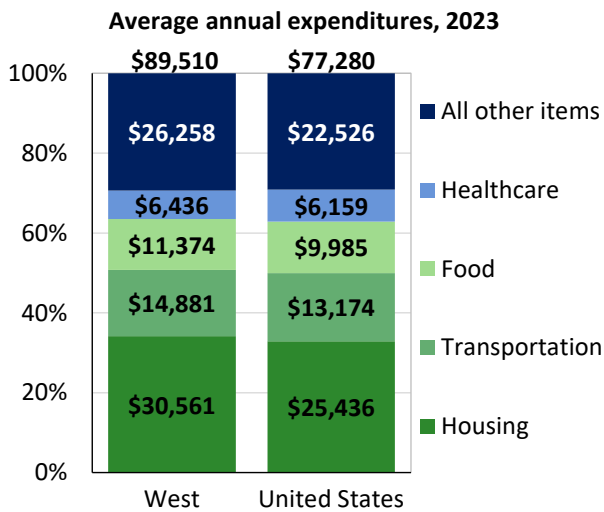

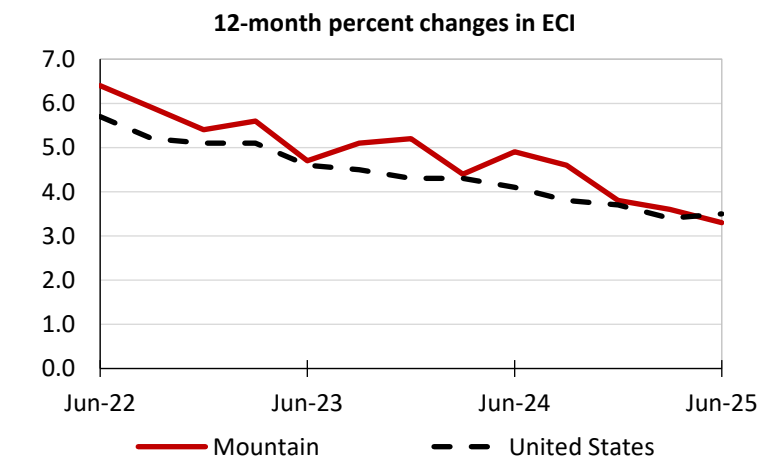
