


Miami, FL, Area Economic Summary

Unemployment rates



Miami area, third quarter 2023



12-month percent changes in employment





Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories


12-month percent change in CPI-U, February 2024

Average annual spending and percent distribution for selected categories


Average annual expenditures, United States and Miami area, 2021-22


