Current Employment Statistics Summary, October 2024


Total nonfarm payroll employment was essentially unchanged in October (+12,000), following monthly gains that averaged 194,000 over the prior 12 months. In October, employment continued to trend up in health care and government. Temporary help services lost jobs. Employment in manufacturing declined due to strike activity.

The employment change for August revised down from +159,000 to +78,000, and the change for September revised down from +254,000 to +223,000. On net, employment over these months is 112.000 lower than previously reported.

In October, average hourly earnings of all employees on private-sector payrolls rose by 13 cents, or 0.4 percent. Over the year, average hourly earnings have increased by 4.0 percent. In October, average weekly hours of all employees were unchanged at 34.3 hours.

+57,000 Private Education and Health Services

Health care employment increased by 52,000 in October, in line with its average monthly gain of 58,000 over the prior 12 months. In October, employment rose in ambulatory health care services (+36,000) and nursing and residential care facilities (+9,000).

+40,000 Government

Employment in government continued its upward trend in October (+40,000), similar to its prior 12-month average monthly gain of 43,000. Over the month, state government employment continued to trend up (+18,000).

+8,000 Construction

Employment in construction changed little in October (+8,000). The industry had added an average of 20,000 jobs per month over the prior 12 months. Over the month,


Employment in temporary help services declined by 49,000 in October. Since reaching a peak in March 2022, temporary help services has lost 577,000 jobs.



Mining and Logging



Recent residential construction-related indicators are mixed. In September, residential building permits decreased, and new residential sales and housing starts changed little. In October, the average 30-year fixed mortgage rate increased.



Manufacturing



Employment in manufacturing fell by 46,000 in October, reflecting a decline of 44,000 in transportation equipment manufacturing that was largely due to <u>strike</u> activity.

In October, the manufacturing 1-month diffusion index rose by 2.0 to 45.1. The manufacturing 1-month diffusion index has remained below 50 for 6 consecutive months. A number below 50 indicates that more manufacturing industries are losing jobs than are adding jobs.

In October, manufacturing average hourly earnings for all employees changed little (+9 cents) to \$34.42. Average hourly earnings for production and nonsupervisory employees, at \$28.19, also changed little (+7 cents).

Average weekly hours of all employees in manufacturing changed little (-0.1 hour) to 39.9 hours in October, while average weekly hours of production and nonsupervisory employees fell by 0.2 hour to 40.6 hours. Over the month, average weekly overtime hours for all employees edged down by 0.1 hour to 2.8 hours, while average weekly overtime hours for production and nonsupervisory employees remained unchanged at 3.6 hours.



Retail Trade



Employment in retail trade changed little in October (-6,000) and has shown little net change over the year.

Recent retail-related economic indicators are mostly positive. In October, the per-gallon price of <u>regular gasoline</u>* decreased, and the <u>Consumer Confidence</u> <u>Index</u> increased. In September, <u>Auto Sales</u> increased, while <u>Retail Sales</u> changed little.

*The per-gallon price of regular gasoline is a weekly measure, and the over-the-month change reflects the difference in price for the week following the week of the 12th for both months.




Employment in transportation and warehousing changed little in October (-4,000) but has expanded by 102,000 since a recent trough in January of this year.


Utilities employment edged down by 2,000 in October, partially offsetting a gain of 3,000 in August.





Employment in professional and business services edged down by 47,000 in October but has shown little net change over the most recent 12 months.

Temporary help services lost 49,000 jobs in October. Since reaching an employment peak in March 2022, temporary help services has shed 577,000 jobs, a decline of 18.1 percent.



Private Education and Health Services

Employment in health care increased by 52,000 in October, in line with its average monthly gain of 58,000 over the prior 12 months.

In October, ambulatory health care services added 36,000 jobs, with a gain in home health care services (+12,000) and offices of dentists (+10,000). Employment also increased in nursing and residential care facilities (+9,000). Over the month, employment continued to trend up in hospitals (+8,000).




Employment in leisure and hospitality changed little in October (-4,000). Over the prior 12 months, the industry had added an average of 24,000 jobs per month.




Employment in government continued to trend up in October (+40,000), in line with its average monthly gain of 43,000 over the prior 12 months.
