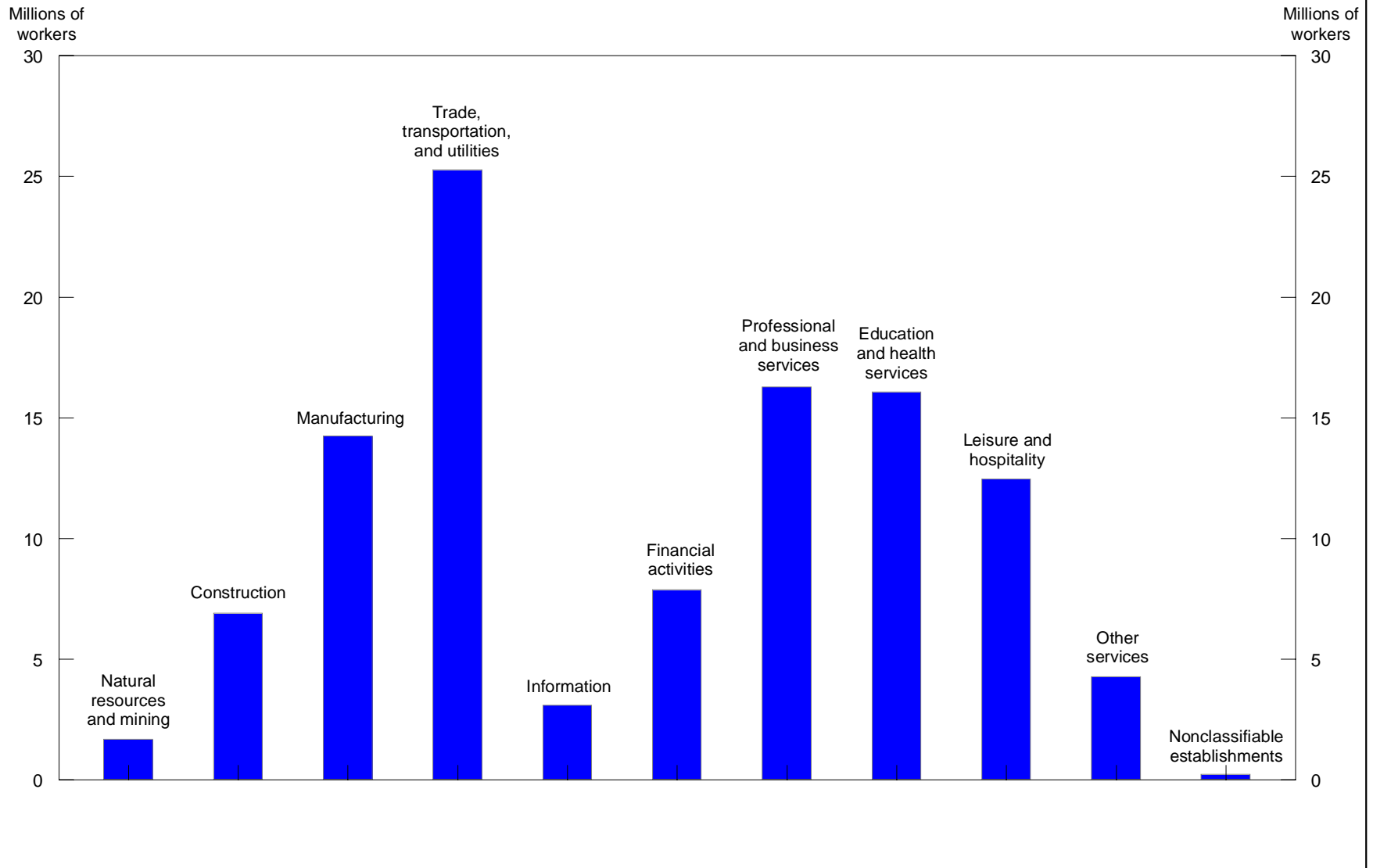
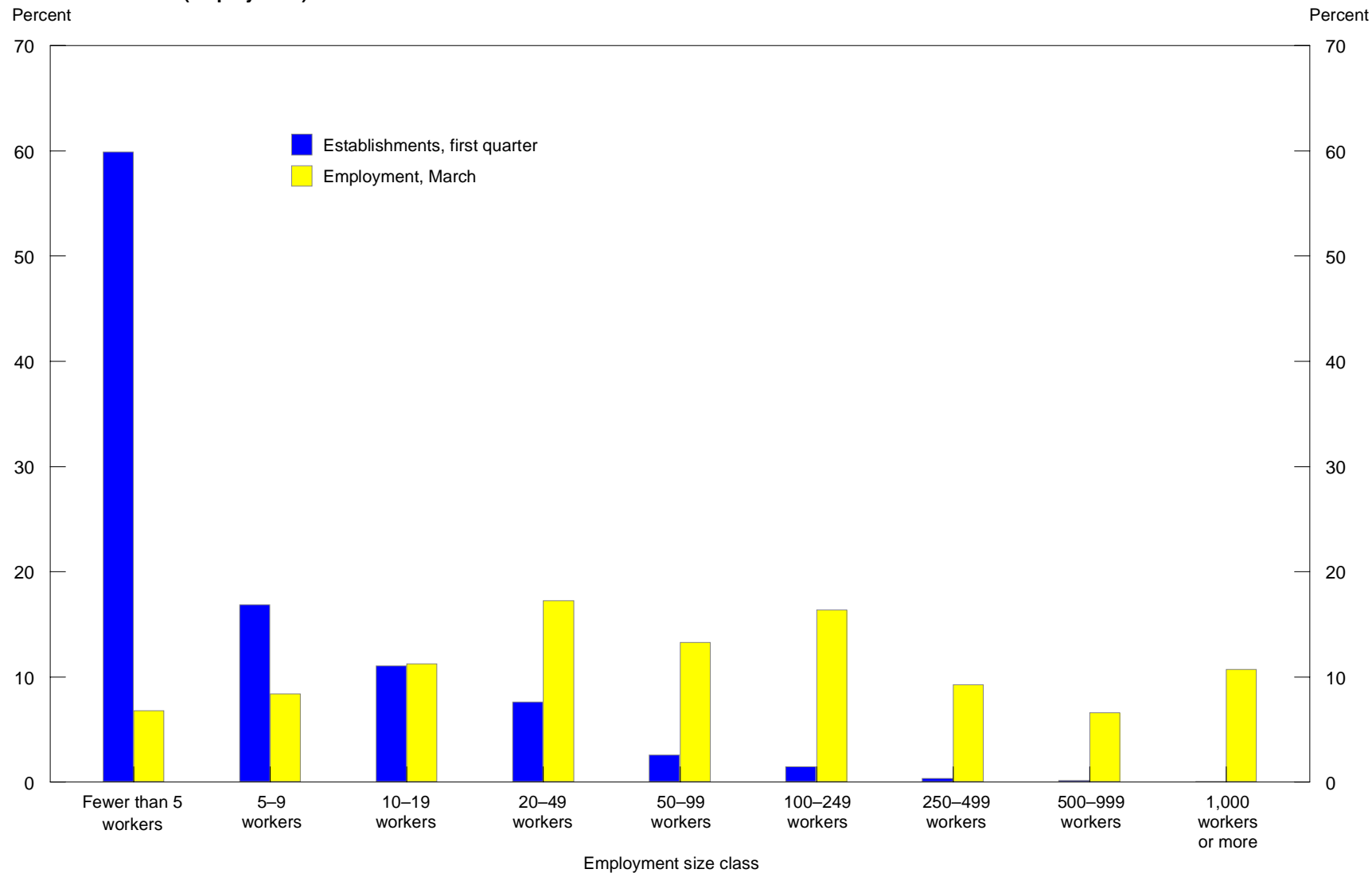


Chart 1. Distribution of private-sector employment by supersector, 2004



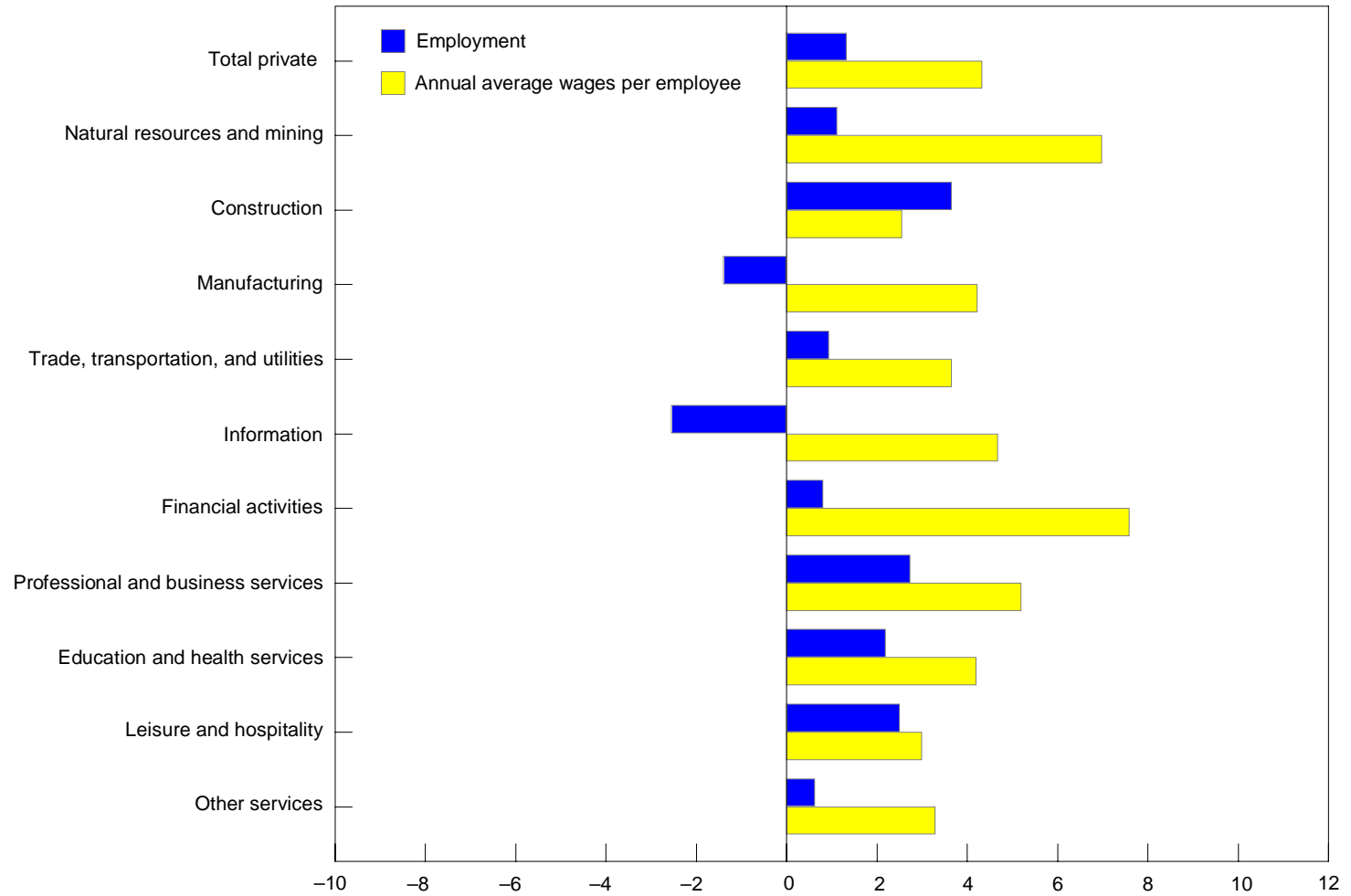

Chart 2. **Percent distribution of private-sector establishments and employment by size class, first quarter 2004 (establishments) and March 2004 (employment)**



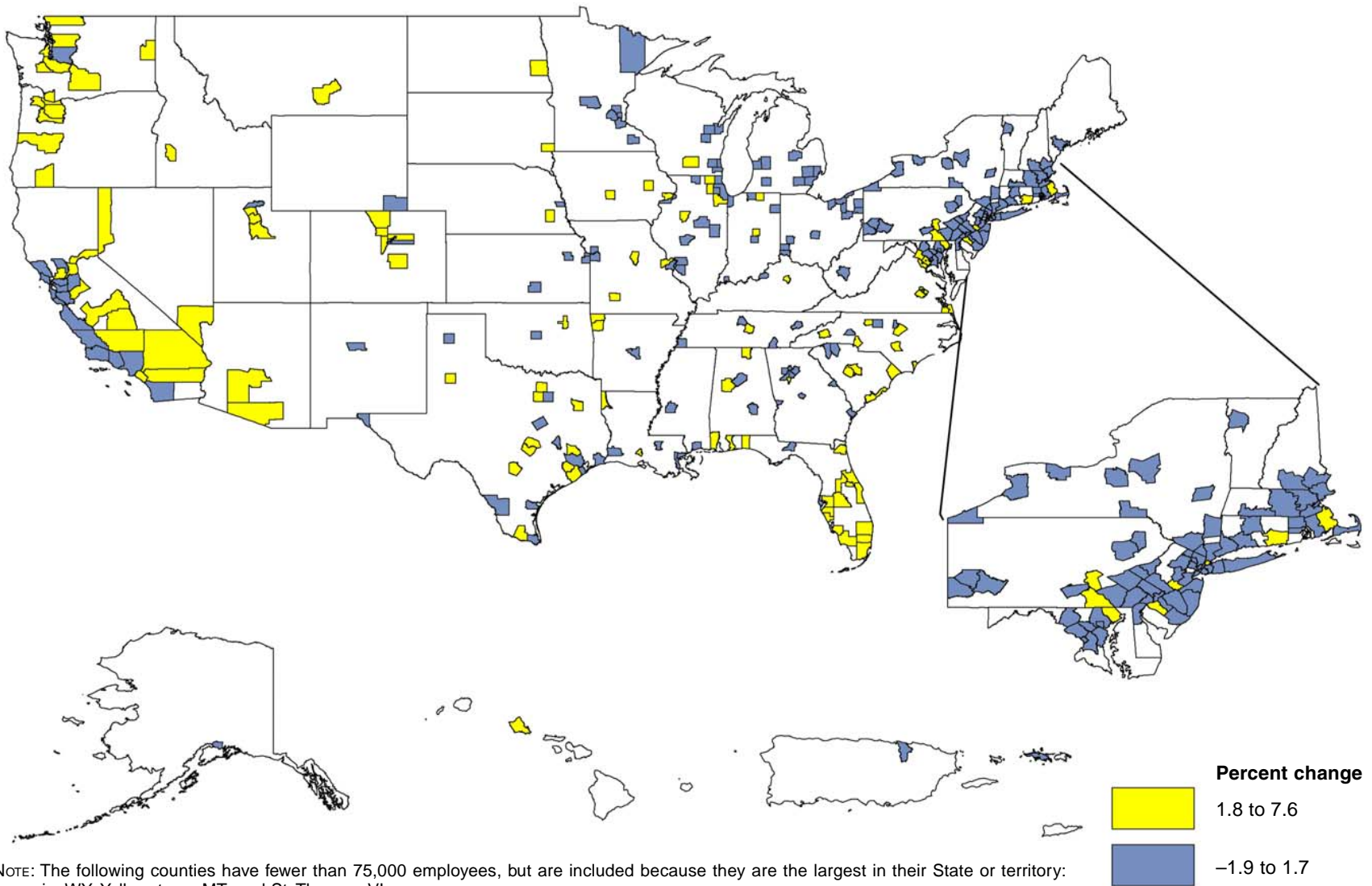

Chart 4. Percent change in employment in counties with 75,000 employees or more, March 2004 to 2005 (U.S. average = 1.7 percent)



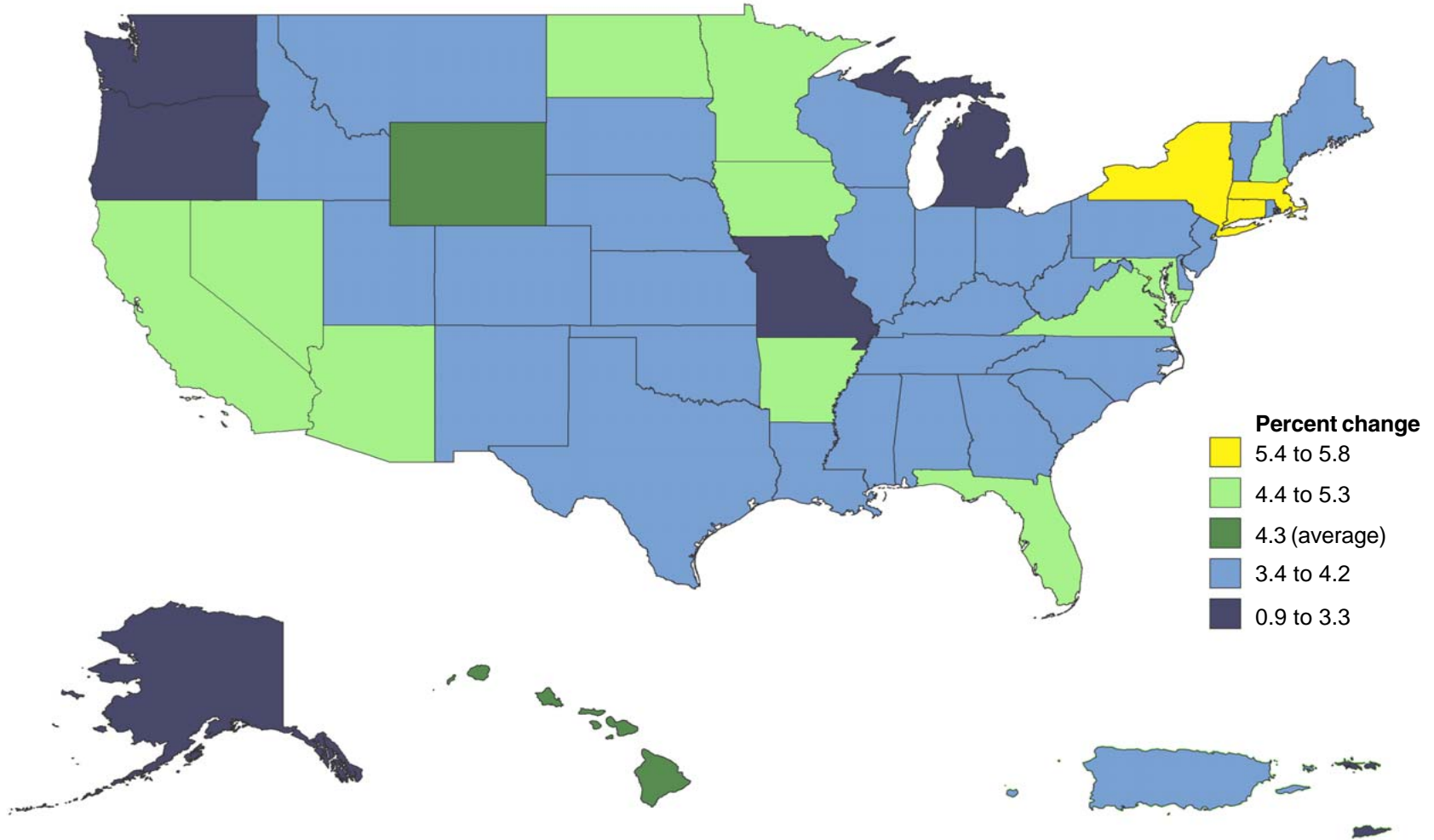

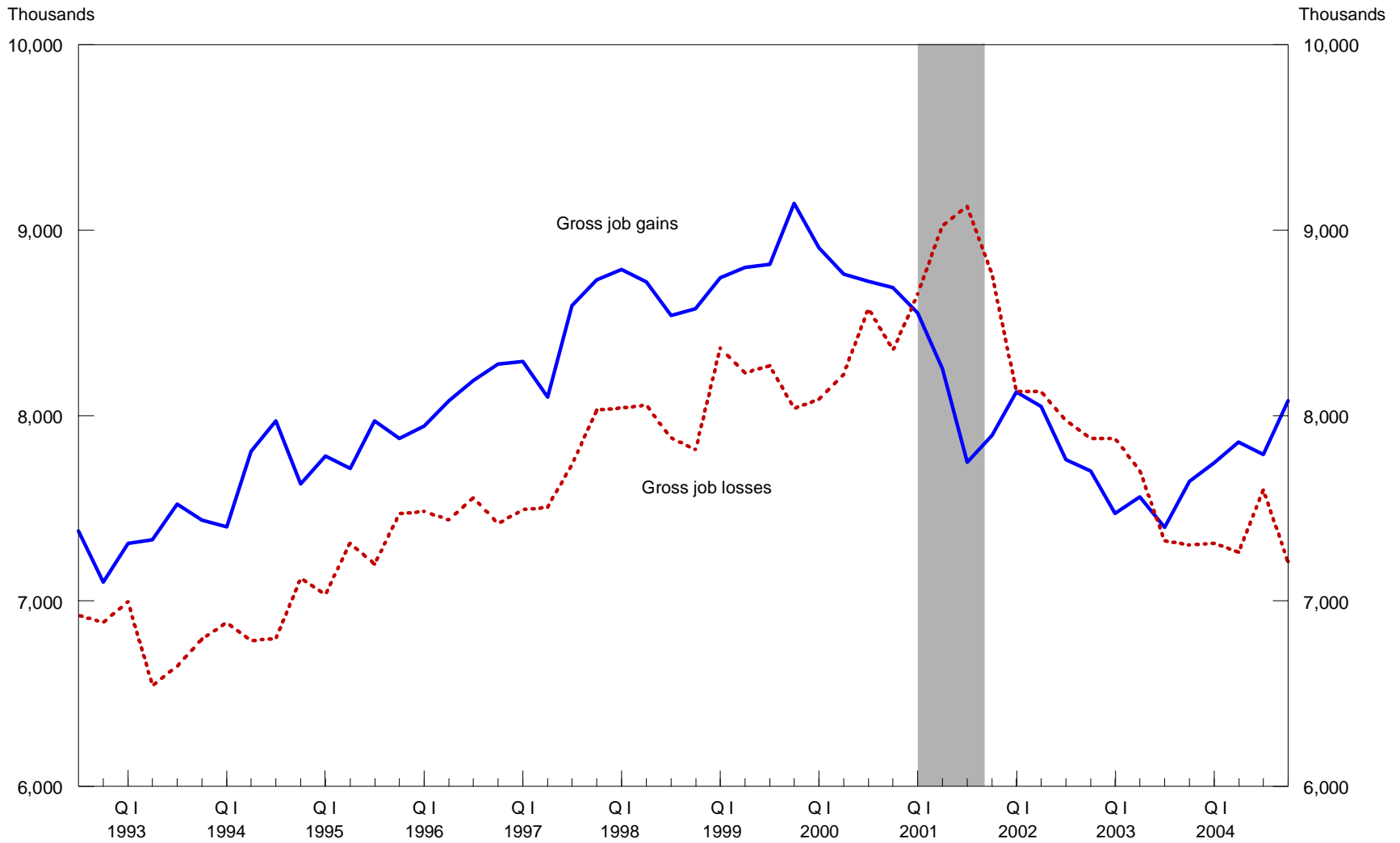

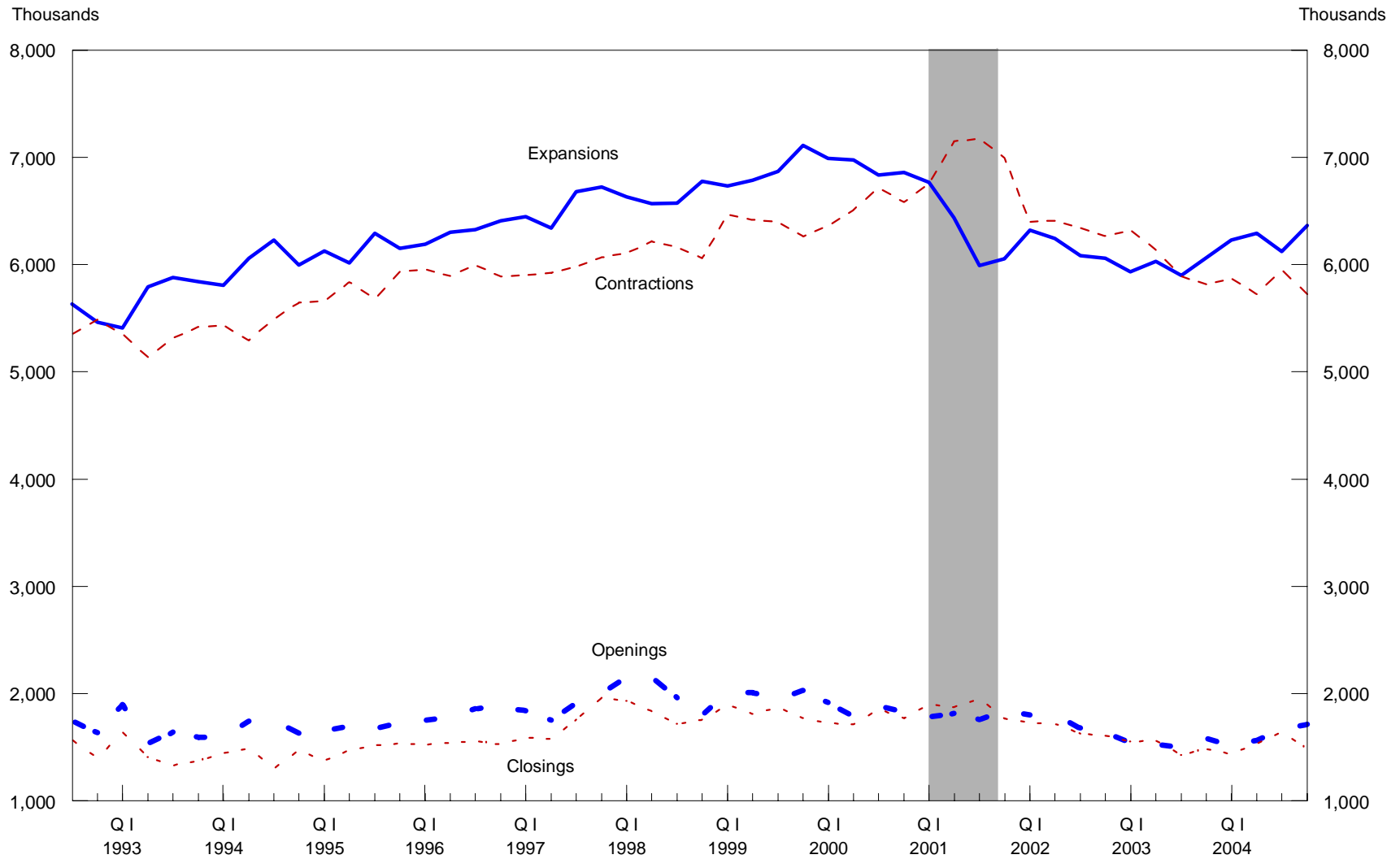
Chart 7. Private-sector gross job gains and gross job losses, seasonally adjusted, September 1992 to December 2004

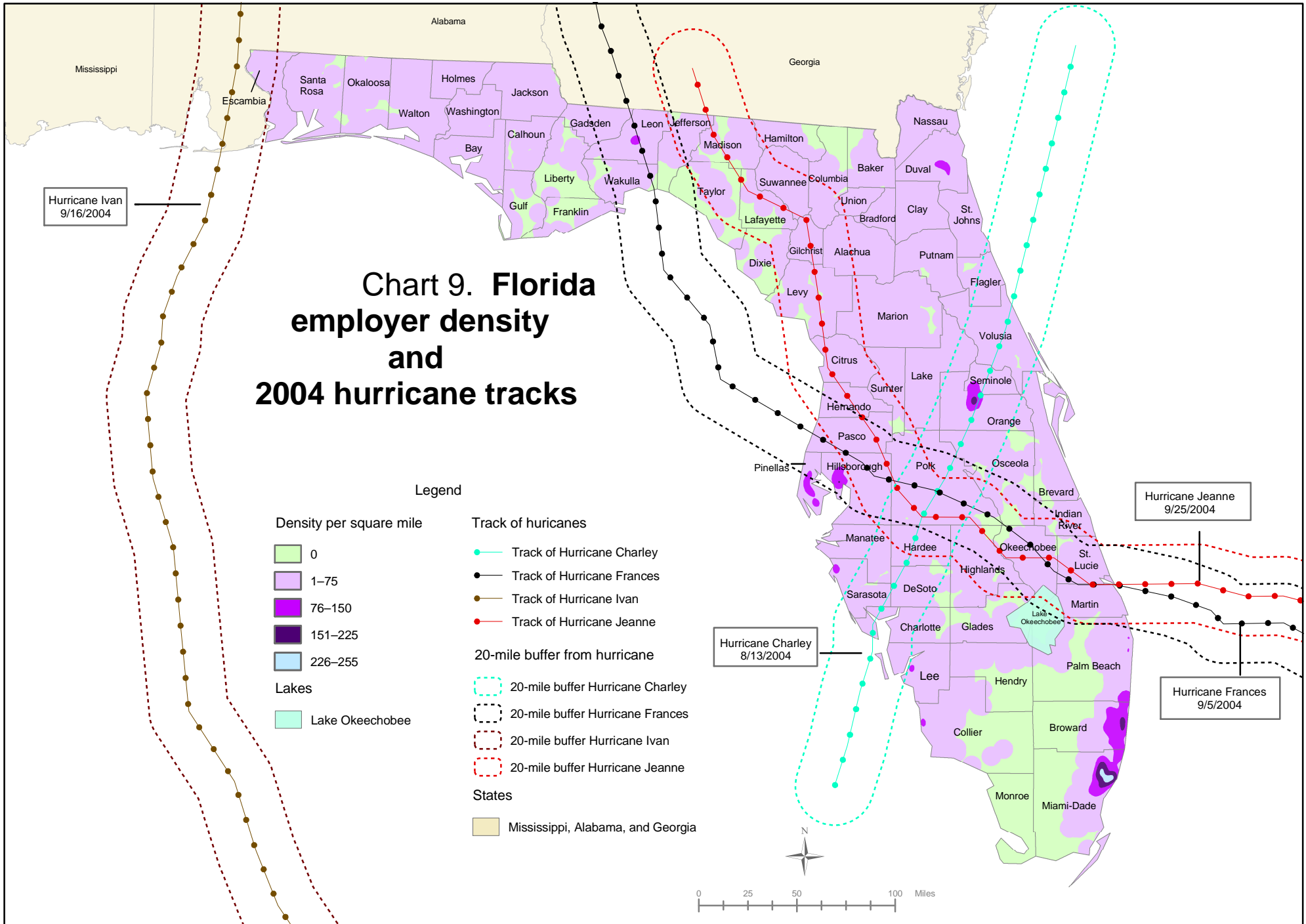
Chart 8. Components of private-sector gross job gains and gross job losses, seasonally adjusted, September 1992 to December 2004
