#### Consumer Expenditure Surveys

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The **Consumer Expenditure Surveys (CE)** program provides data on expenditures, income, and demographic characteristics of consumers in the United States. The CE program provides these data in <u>tables</u>, <u>LABSTAT database</u>, <u>news releases</u>, <u>reports</u>, and <u>public use microdata files</u>.

CE data are collected by the Census Bureau for BLS in two surveys: the Interview Survey for major and/or recurring items and the Diary Survey for more minor or frequently purchased items. CE data are primarily used to revise the relative importance of goods and services in the market basket of the Consumer Price Index. The CE is the only Federal household survey to provide information on the complete range of consumers' expenditures and incomes. Here is an <u>overview of the CE</u> program and its methods.





# What's coming?

- 2022 annual data release, Friday September 8<sup>th</sup>:
  - 2022 tables product.
  - Second half of 2022 public use microdata.
- Further LABSTAT expansion:
  - Aggregates, Relative Shares.
  - Detailed expenditures:
    - Will be subject to suppression.
  - Medians? Reporters only?



# What's coming?

### 2023 questionnaire changes:

- Education:
  - Combined education, school meals.
  - Adult day care and convalescent care at home from medical expenses.
  - Babysitting and childcare items from miscellaneous expenses. Some education expenses were moved out.
- Transportation:
  - Combined the questions on vehicle operating expenses and questions on taxis and public transportation from the earlier expense patterns section.
- Questionnaires are published online:
  - <u>https://www.bls.gov/cex/csxsurveyforms.htm</u>.
  - The program is working on developing a document to house annual changes from year to year.



# What's on the horizon?

### 2024 questionnaire changes:

- General housing characteristics.
- Rental/Owned property.
- Utilities.
- Home improvement, repairs, and household services.
- Medical expenses.
- Vehicles.
- Trips.
- And more!



# What's on the horizon?

- Continue to work towards 508 compliancy on the website:
  - Developing table output in HTML.
  - More charts and visuals on homepage.



# What's on the horizon?

- Asset and Liability Imputation:
  - Implement imputation process for Asset and Liability (A&L) data collected in the Consumer Expenditure Surveys (CE).
  - Based on WESTAT recommendation:
