
Chart 3-8. About one-third of workers displaced from fulltime jobs in 2003-2004 found full-time jobs that paid at least what they made on their old jobs

## Chart 3-8. About one-third of workers displaced from full-time jobs in 2003-2004 found full-time jobs that paid at least what they made on their old jobs

- Some displaced workers drop out of the labor force after losing their jobs; others look for work. Most find work again.
- About one-third of those displaced from full-time jobs during the 2003-2004
  period had found new full-time wage and salary jobs that paid at least as much
  as their old job and about one-third found full-time jobs that paid less. The
  remainder were not in the labor force, looking for work, or working part time
  or for themselves.
