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## Adjustments to Household Survey Population Estimates in January 2023

Household survey data beginning in January 2023 reflect updated population estimates, also referred to as population controls. These are independent estimates of population used to weight the household survey sample results to reflect the civilian noninstitutional population age 16 and older. (Additional information about household survey population controls, including adjustments for prior years, is available in the <u>Current Population Survey technical documentation</u>.)

The U.S. Census Bureau develops the population estimates for the household survey. Each year, the Census Bureau adjusts the estimates to include the latest information about population change and to incorporate any improvements in the estimation methodology.

The population adjustments incorporated with household survey data for January 2023 reflect the blended 2020 population base, which combines population totals from the 2020 Census and demographic characteristics from other sources. The January 2023 adjustments reflect updated birth and death statistics; new estimates of net international migration, which reflect recent increased <u>international</u> <u>migration</u>; and methodological improvements. The majority of the overall population level change is due to the increase in net international migration in this year's adjustment, which follows reduced international migration due to the pandemic. However, other changes in the characteristics of the population are due to methodological improvements to the blended base.

In addition, effective with data for January 2023, household survey estimates for veterans incorporate population controls derived from a new Department of Veterans Affairs Veteran Population Projection Model (VetPop2020). Information about the <u>Veteran Population Projection Model</u> is available from the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Following usual Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) practice, official household survey estimates for December 2022 and earlier months were not revised; consequently, household survey data for January 2023 will not be directly comparable with data for December 2022 or earlier periods.

To evaluate the impact of population control adjustments on key labor force data, BLS produces special tabulations of December data that incorporate the new population controls. The difference between the special tabulations and the official December estimates (not seasonally adjusted) shows the effect of the adjustment. The adjustment effect may be either positive or negative.
