Four types of events have been the most frequent since the workplace fatality census began. Highway incidents have been the leading event since 1992.

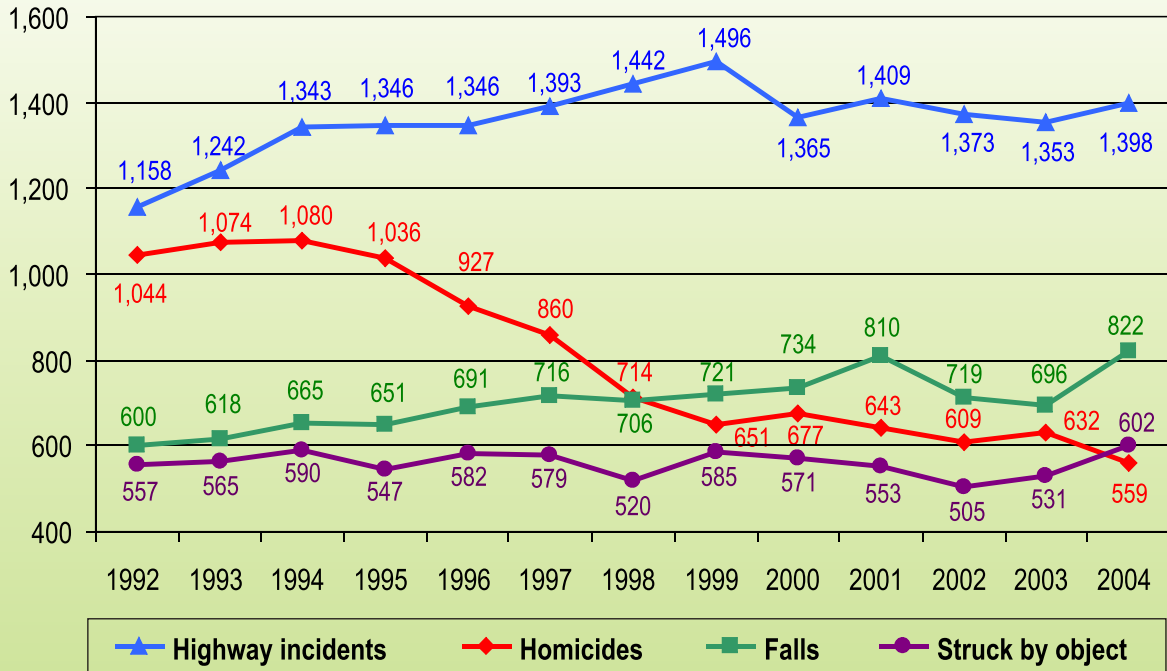
Workplace homicides have declined substantially since 1994, while falls and highway incidents have trended higher.

Being struck by an object overtook homicides as the third-most-frequent fatal event in 2004, just after highway incidents and falls and just before fourth-place homicides.
