This supplemental information was part of a pilot study on days of job transfer or restriction. The pilot included six 3-digit industries including: Specialty trade contractors; Food manufacturing; Building material and garden equipment supplies dealers; Air transportation; Warehousing and storage; and Nursing and residential care facilities.
