
Manufacturing, health care and social assistance, and retail trade combined accounted for more than half of all reported injuries. A total of 1.3 million injuries, or 32 percent, occurred in the goods-producing industries while 2.7 million, or 68 percent, occurred in the service-providing industries.

Goods-producing industries employed nearly 22 percent of the private sector workforce covered by this program, while service-providing industries employed 78 percent of the workforce.
