
Bodily reaction and exertion, contact with objects and equipment, and falls accounted for almost 90 percent of all nonfatal injuries and illnesses that resulted in days away from work in 2004.

Bodily reaction and exertion and contact with objects and equipment accounted for more than two-thirds of all disabling conditions.

Seventy percent of all cases of bodily reaction and exertion were reported in the service-providing industries.
