
Goods-producing industries made up 21 percent of private-industry employment, but accounted for 32 percent of injuries and illnesses with days away from work. Service-providing industries made up 79 percent of employment and 68 percent of injuries and illnesses in 2005.

Parts and materials were the most frequently cited source in goods-producing industries, while floor and ground surfaces were the most frequently cited source in service-providing industries

The most common event involving an illness or injury in goods-producing industries was contact with an object or equipment, while the most common event in service-providing industries was overexertion.
