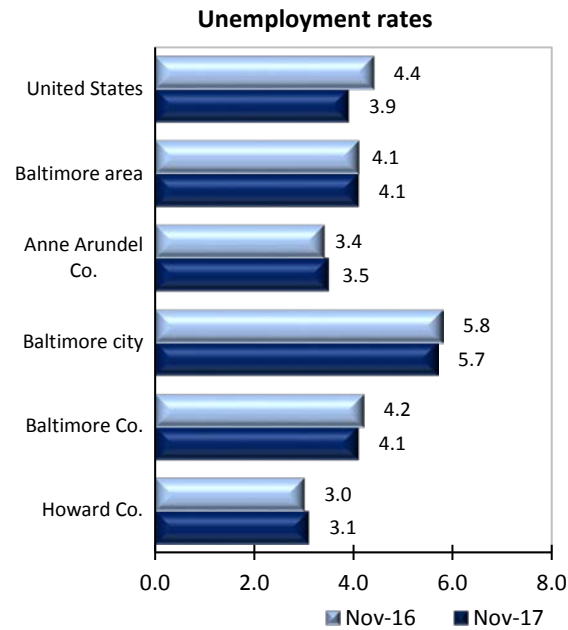


Baltimore Area Economic Summary

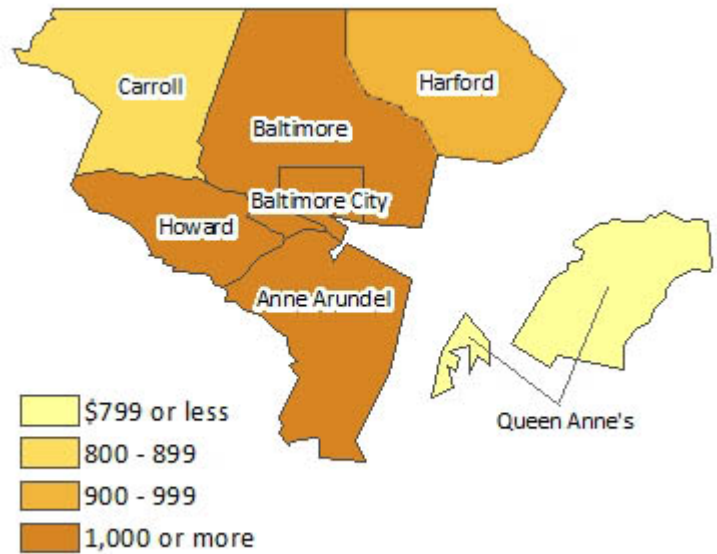
Unemployment rates for the Baltimore area, selected area counties, and the nation

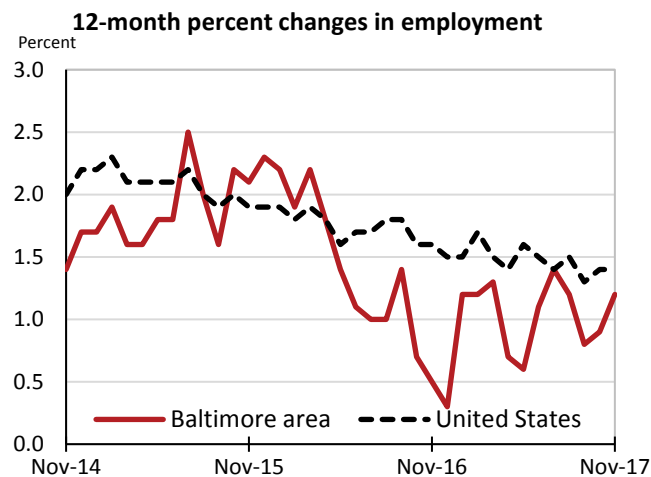
Average weekly wages for all industries by county

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector



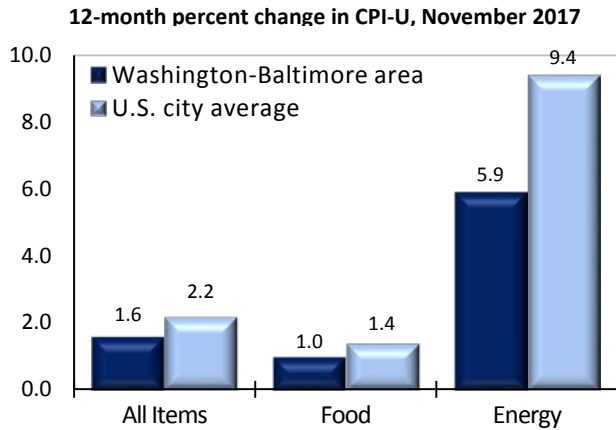

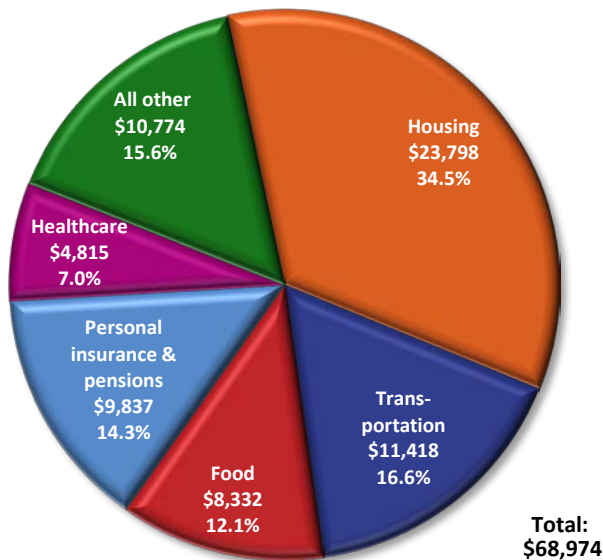
Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

Baltimore area average annual expenditures 2015-16



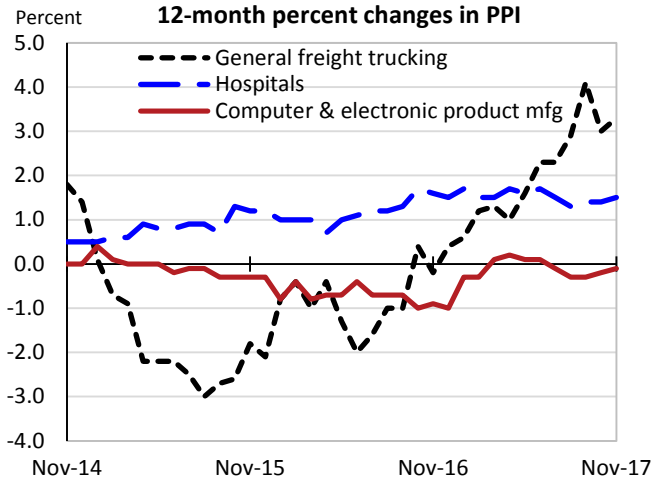

Over-the-year changes in the selling prices received by producers for selected industries nationwide



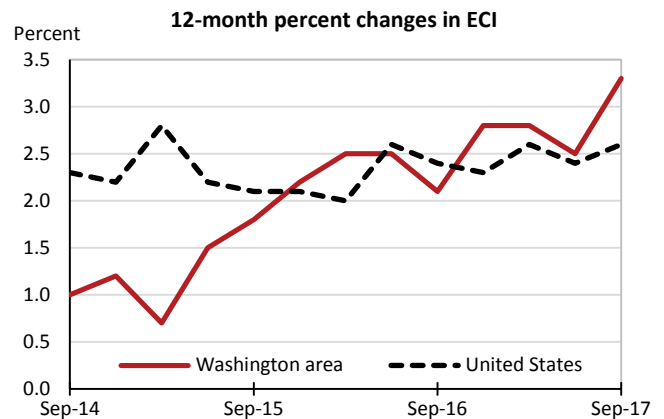
