


Bloomington, IL, Area Economic Summary

Unemployment rates



Bloomington area, 2nd quarter 2016





Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories


12-month percent change in CPI-U, December 2016

Average annual spending and percent distribution for selected categories


Midwest Region average annual expenditures 2015


