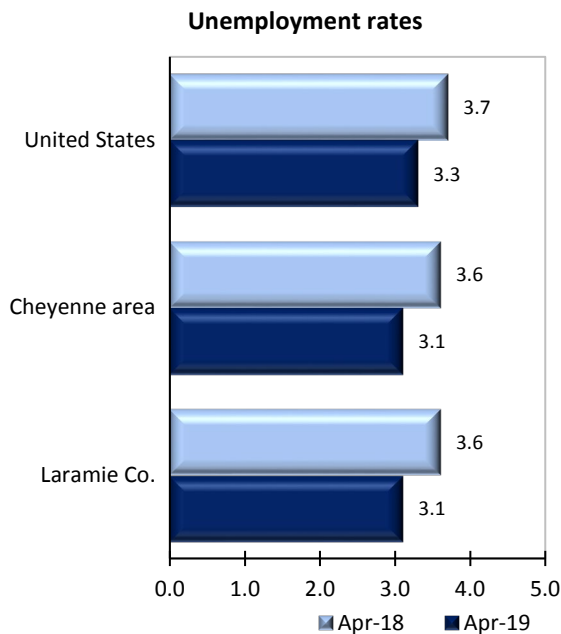


Cheyenne Area Economic Summary

Unemployment rates for the Cheyenne area, selected area counties, and the nation

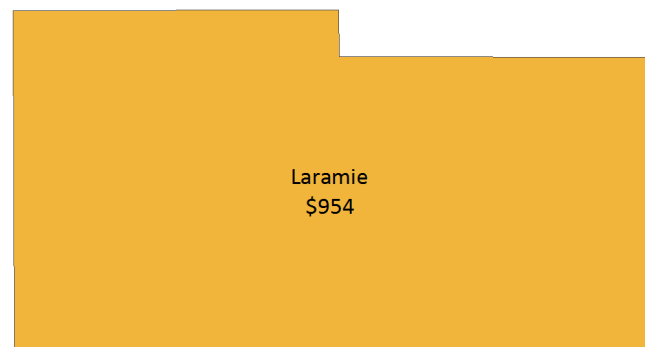

Average weekly wages for all industries by county

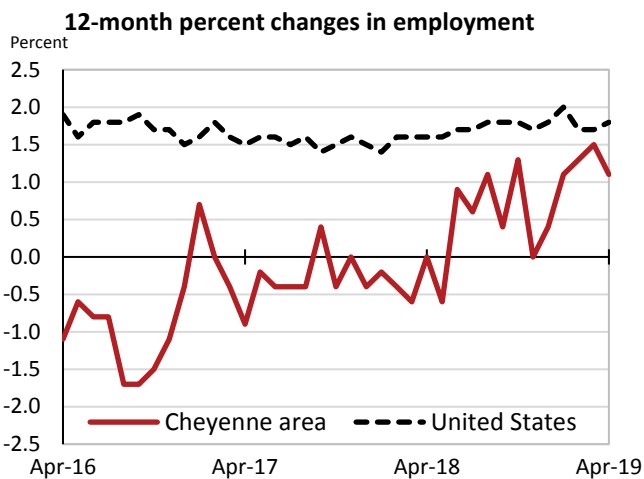
Cheyenne area, 4th quarter 2018

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector

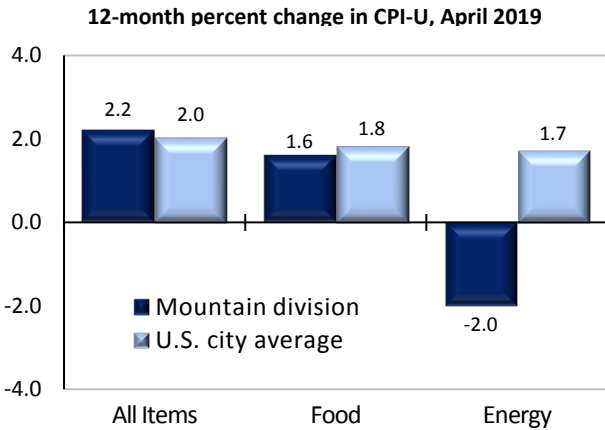

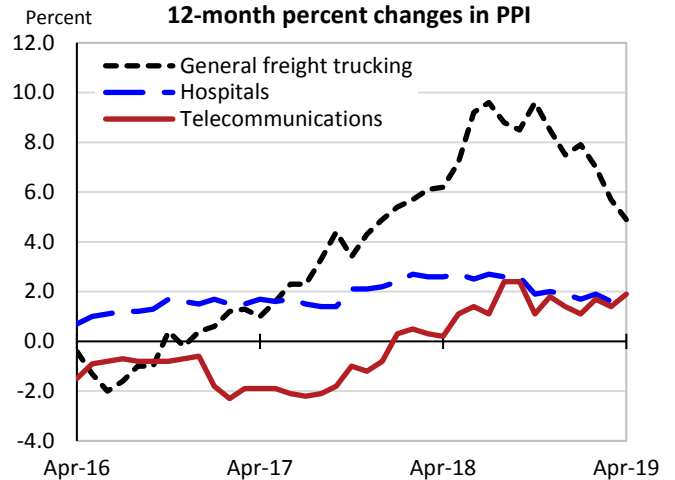

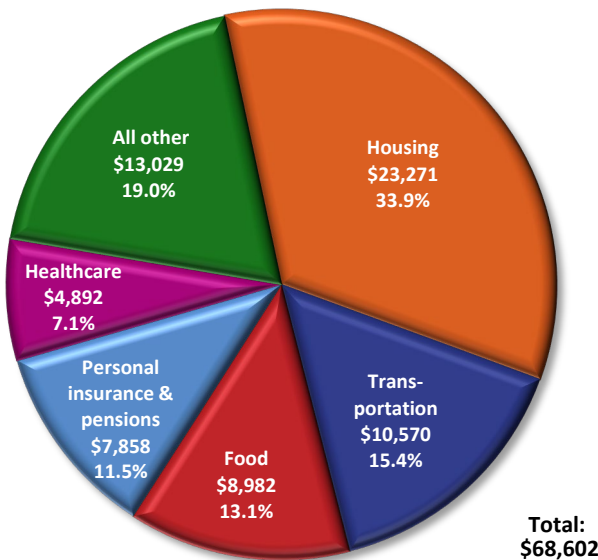
Over-the-year changes in the selling prices received by producers for selected industries nationwide

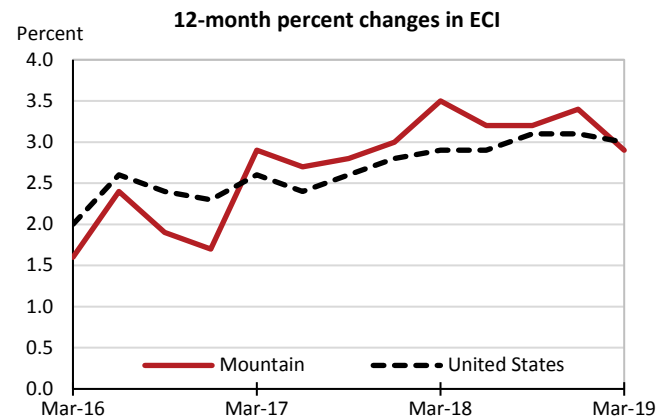
