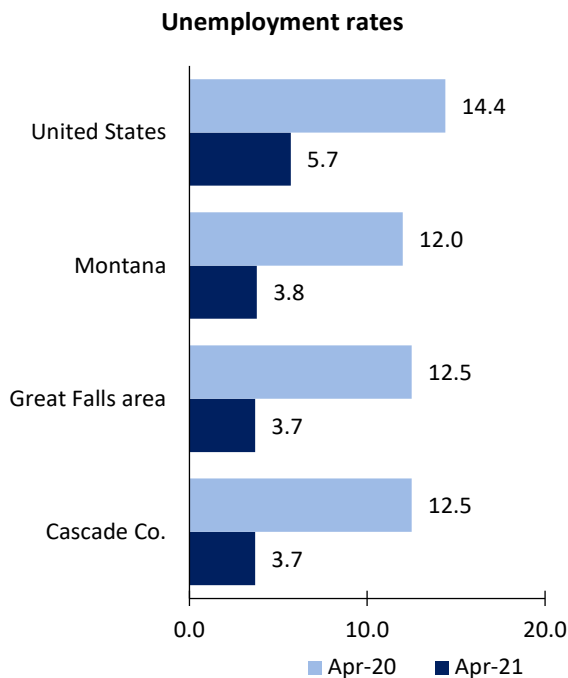


Great Falls Area Economic Summary

Average weekly wages for all industries by county

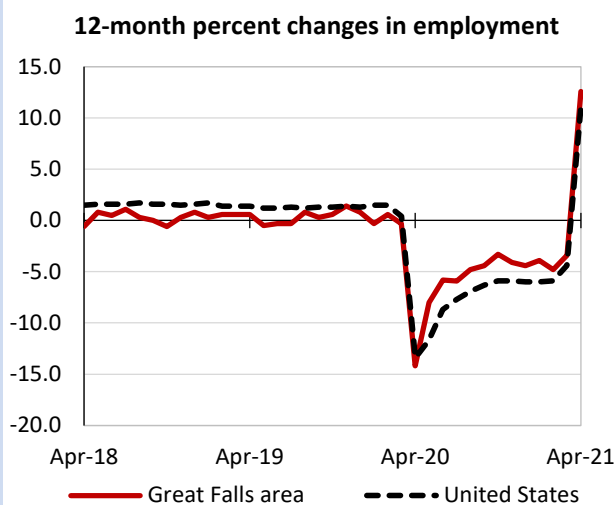
Great Falls area, fourth quarter 2020

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector

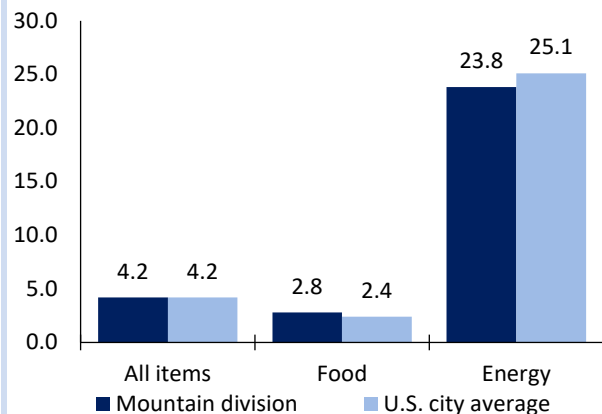

Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

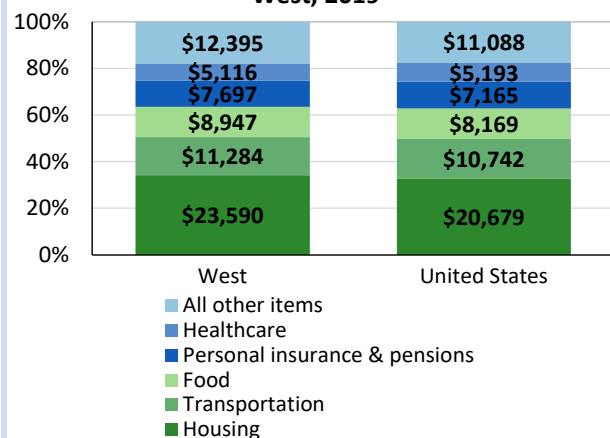
12-month percent change in CPI-U, April 2021

Average annual spending and percent distribution for selected categories

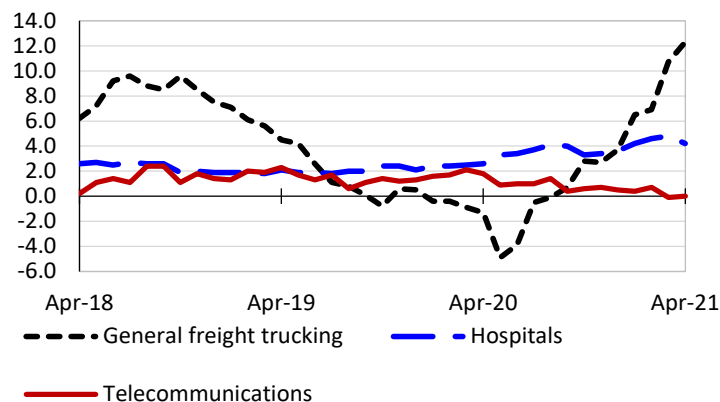
Average annual expenditures, United States and West, 2019

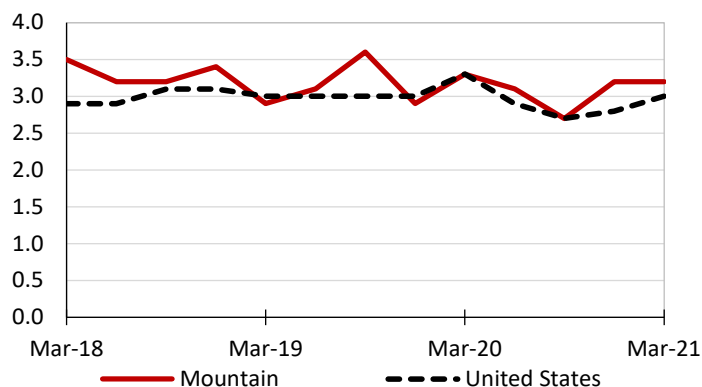
