

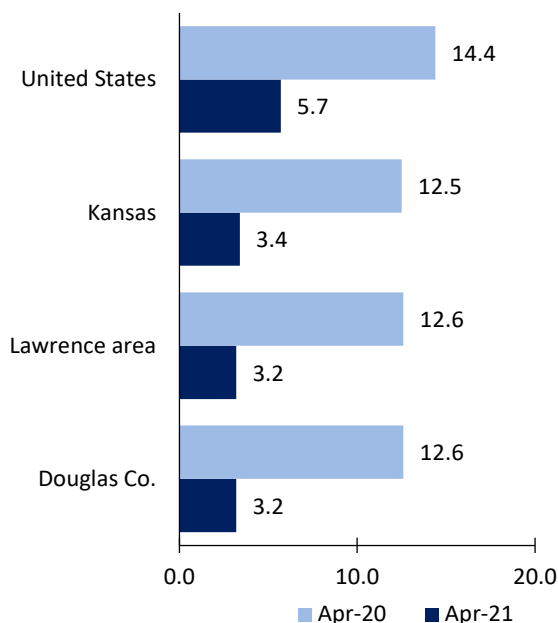
Lawrence Area Economic Summary

Unemployment rates

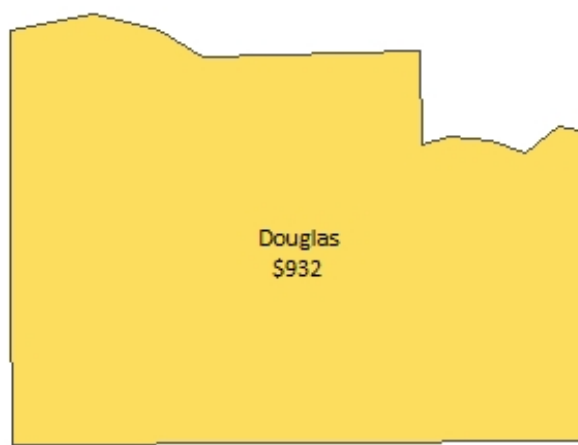

Lawrence area, fourth quarter 2020

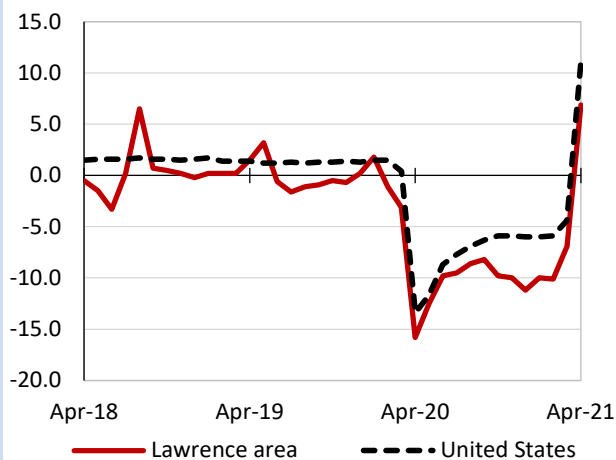

12-month percent changes in employment



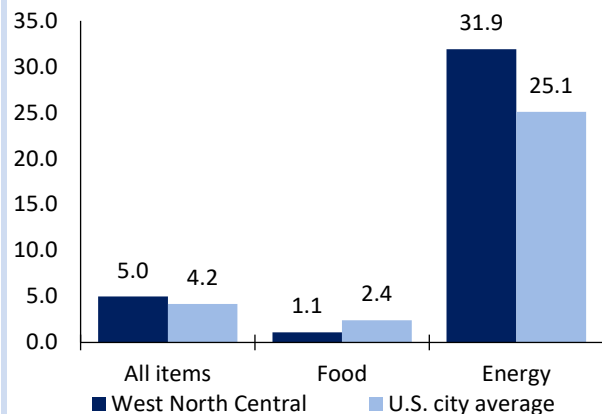

Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

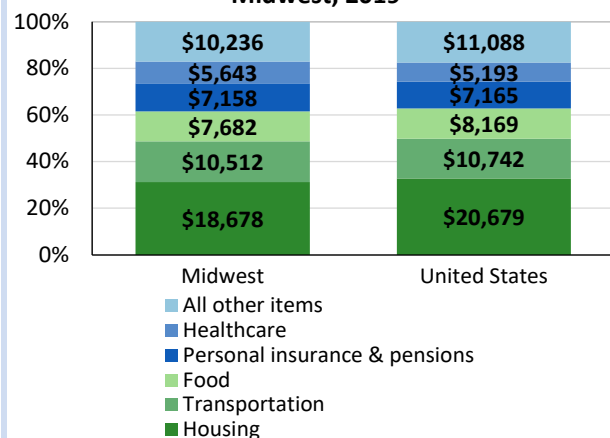
12-month percent change in CPI-U, April 2021

Average annual spending and percent distribution for selected categories

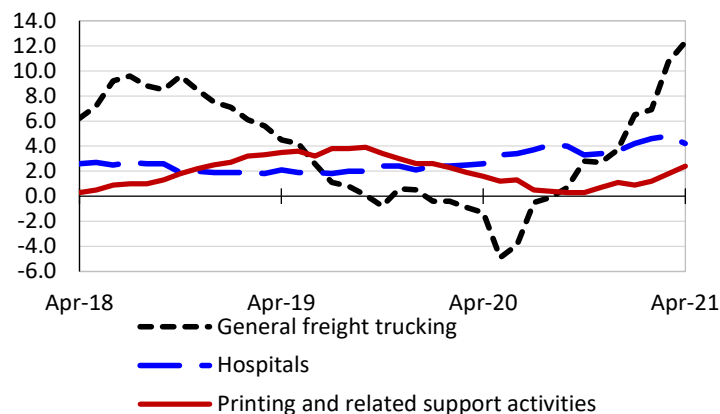
Average annual expenditures, United States and Midwest, 2019

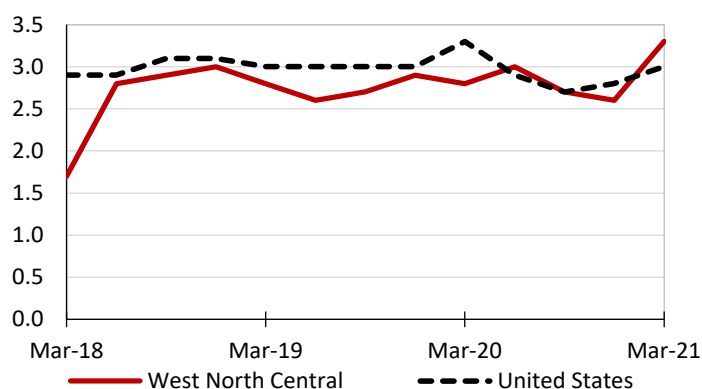
