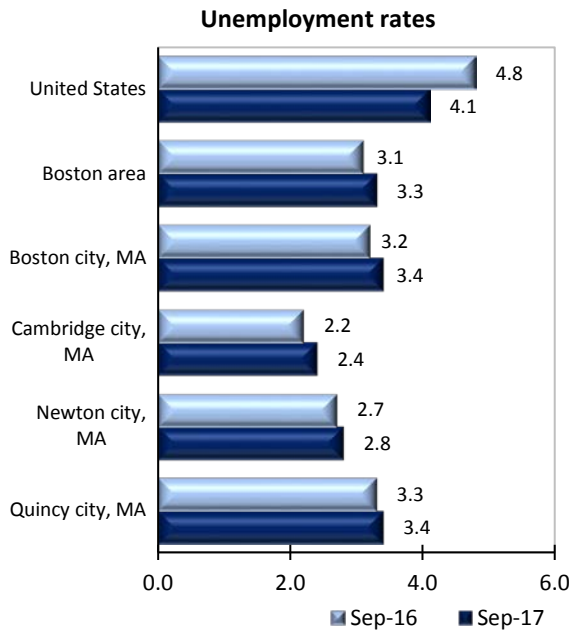


Boston, MA-NH Area Economic Summary

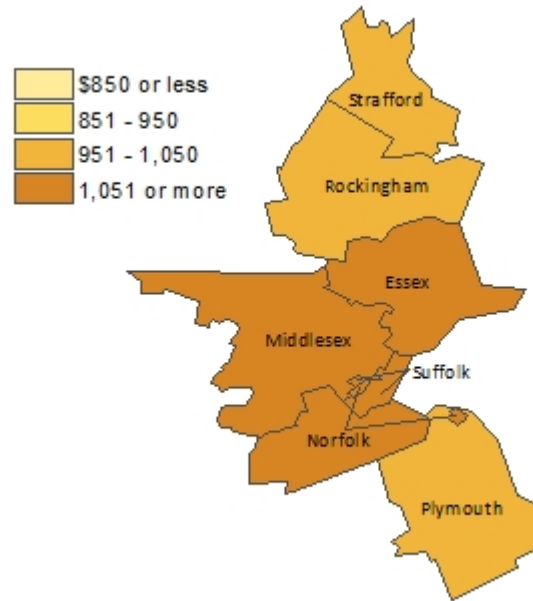
Unemployment rates for the Boston area, selected area cities, and the nation

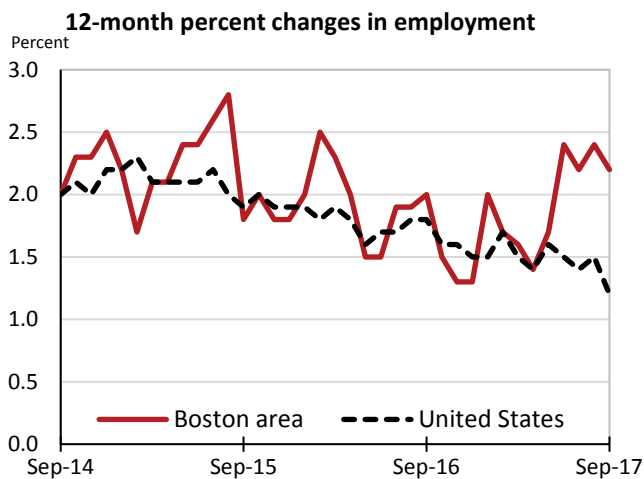
Average weekly wages for all industries by county

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector



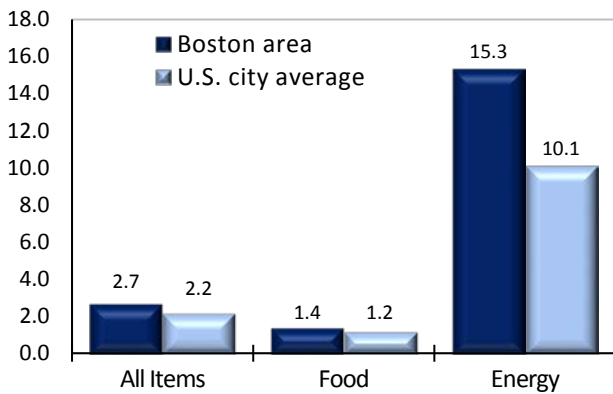

Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

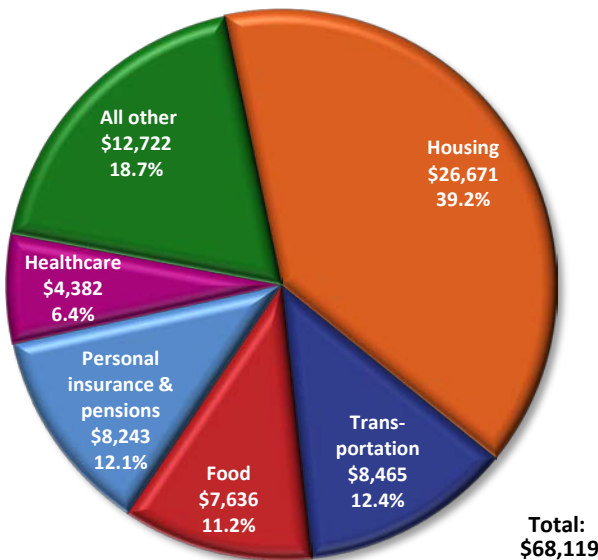
12-month percent change in CPI-U, September 2017

Average annual spending and percent distribution for selected categories

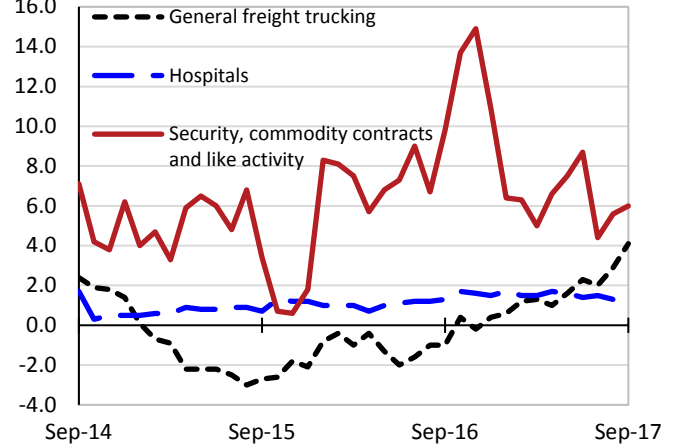
Boston area average annual expenditures 2015-16

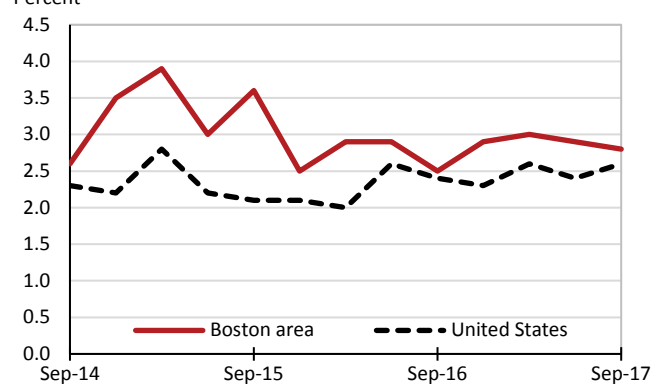
