

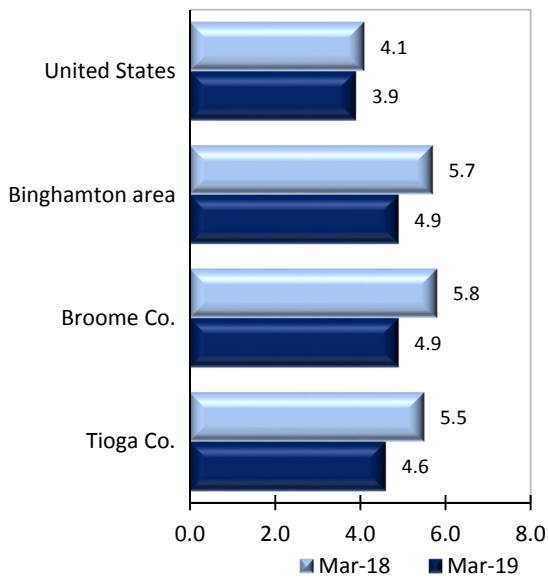
Binghamton Area Economic Summary

Binghamton area, 3rd quarter 2018

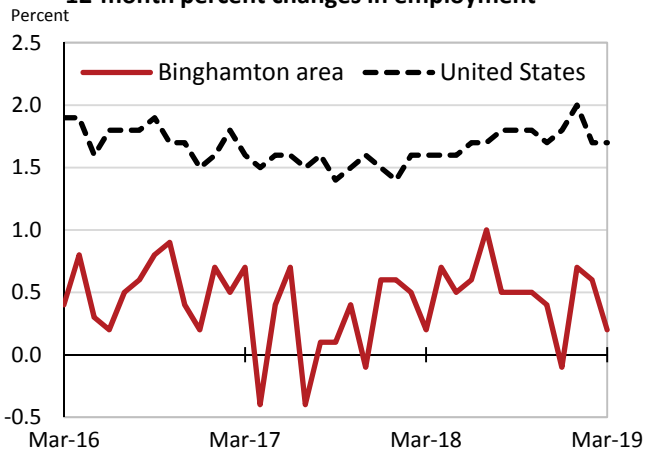

12-month percent changes in employment



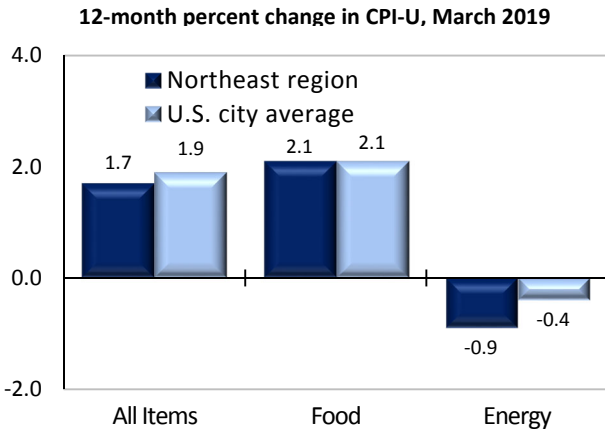

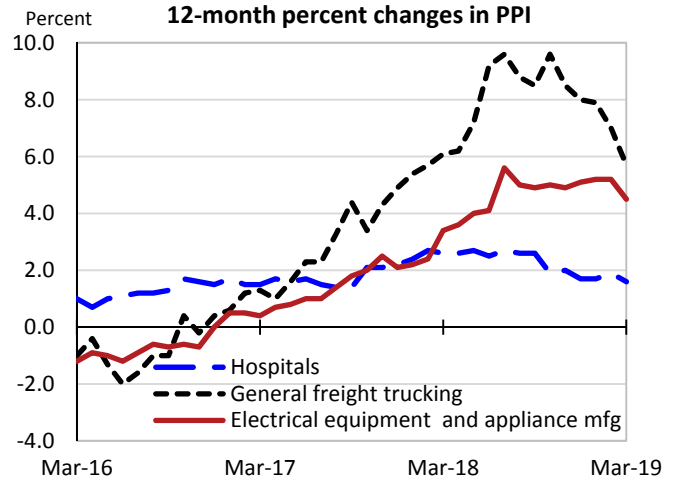


Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

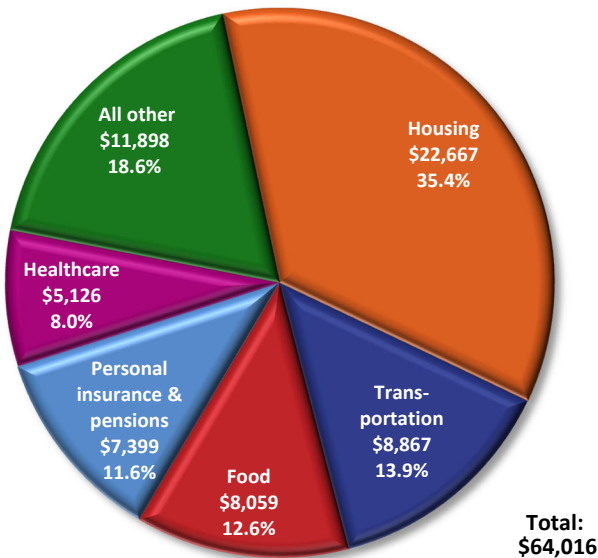
Over-the-year changes in the selling prices received by producers for selected industries nationwide

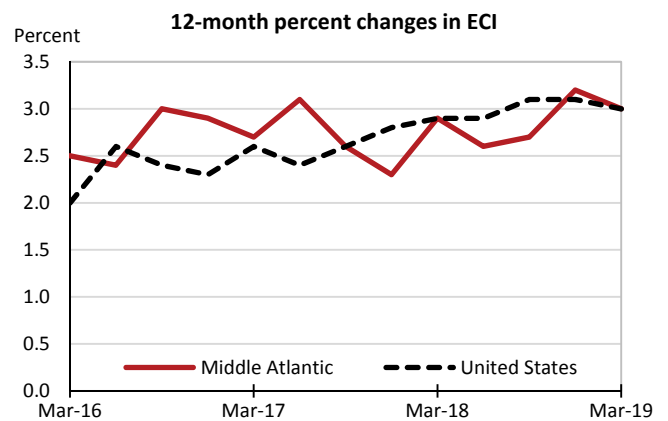
