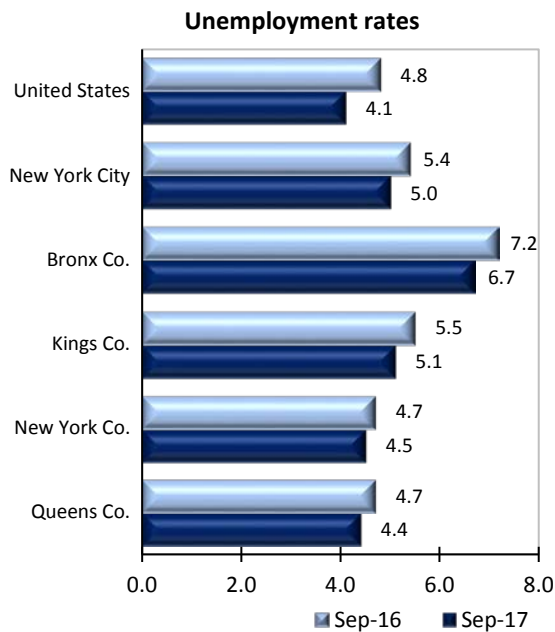


New York City Economic Summary

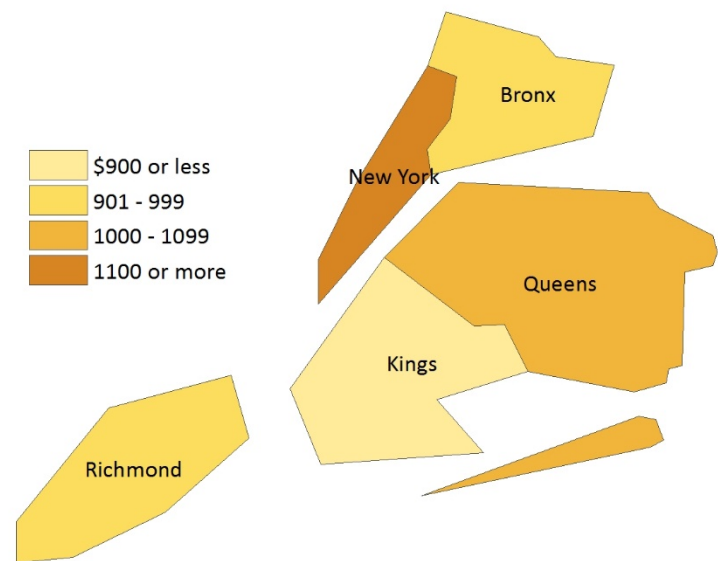
Unemployment rates for the New York City, selected area counties, and the nation

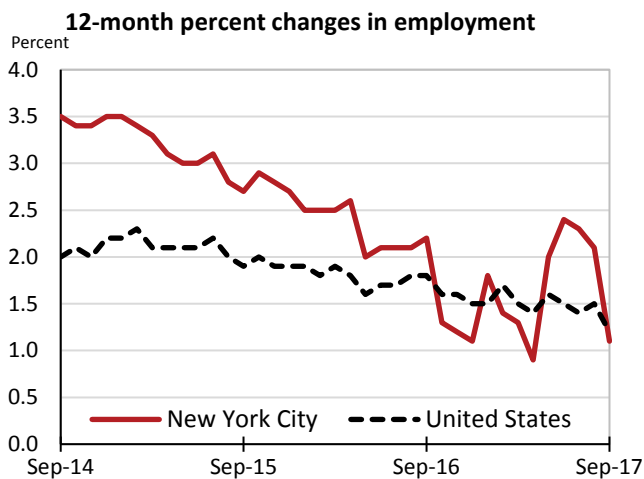
Average weekly wages for all industries by county

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector



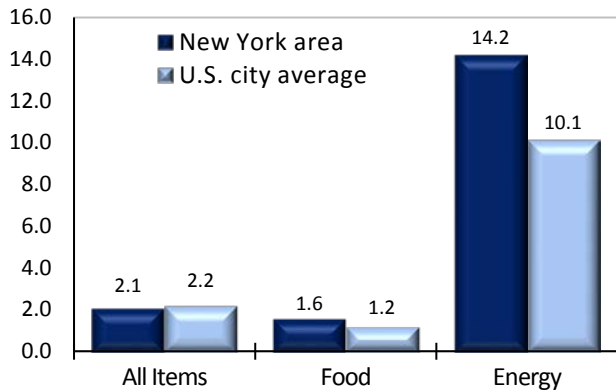

Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

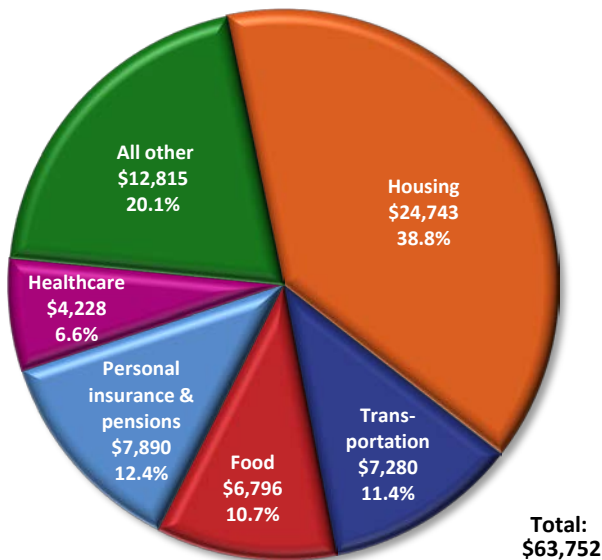
12-month percent change in CPI-U, September 2017

Average annual spending and percent distribution for selected categories

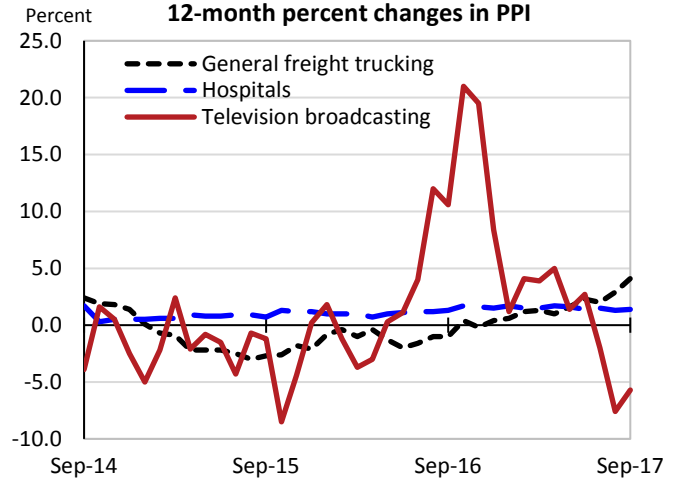
New York area average annual expenditures 2015-16

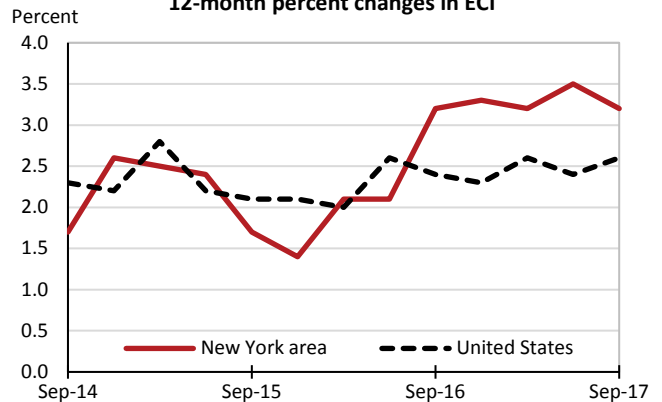
