

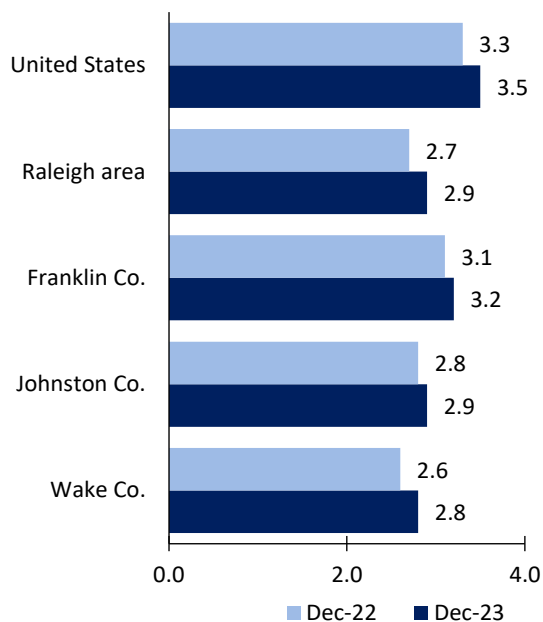
# Raleigh, NC, Area Economic Summary

### Unemployment rates

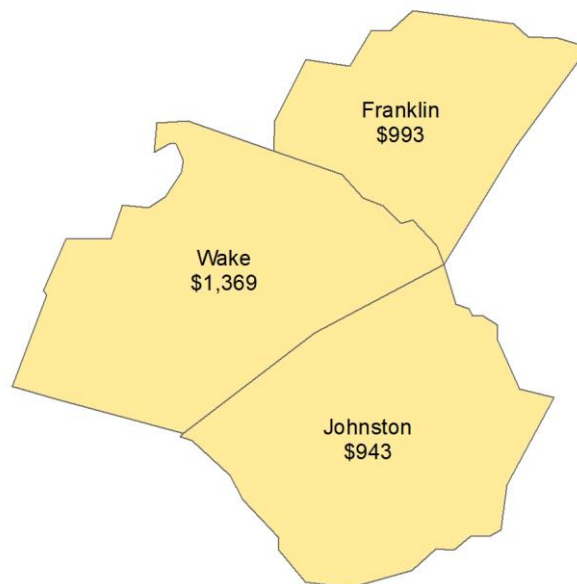

### Raleigh area, second quarter 2023

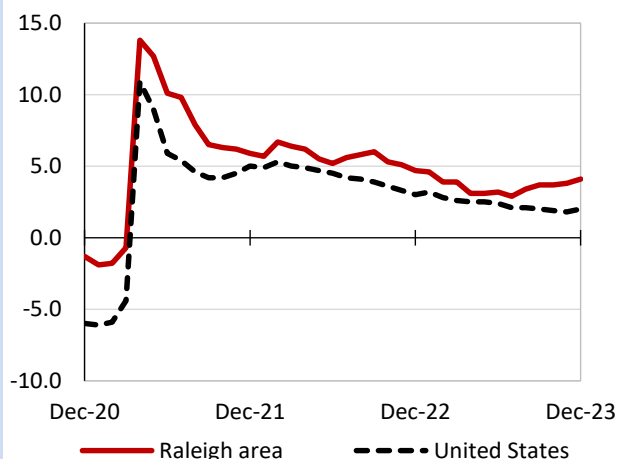

### 12-month percent changes in employment



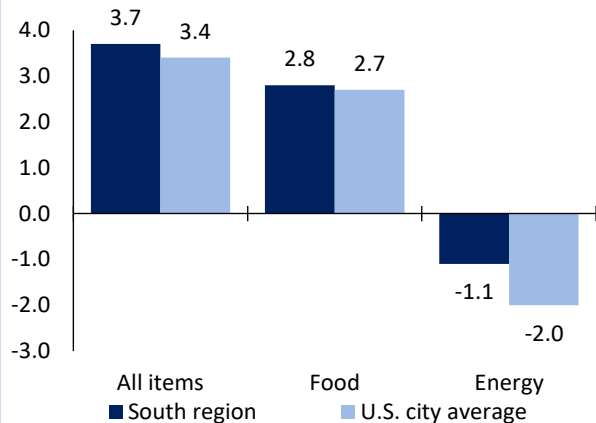

Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

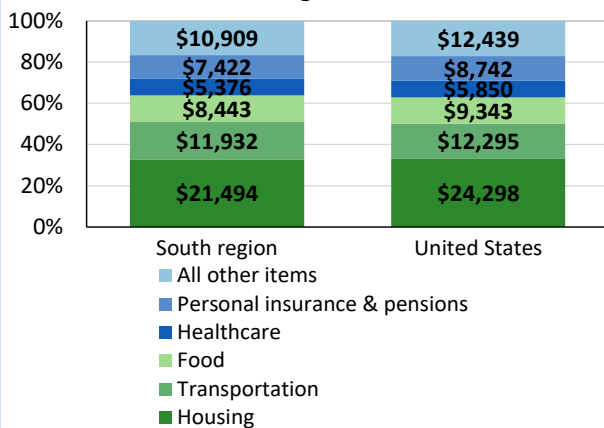
12-month percent change in CPI-U, December 2023

Average annual spending and percent distribution for selected categories

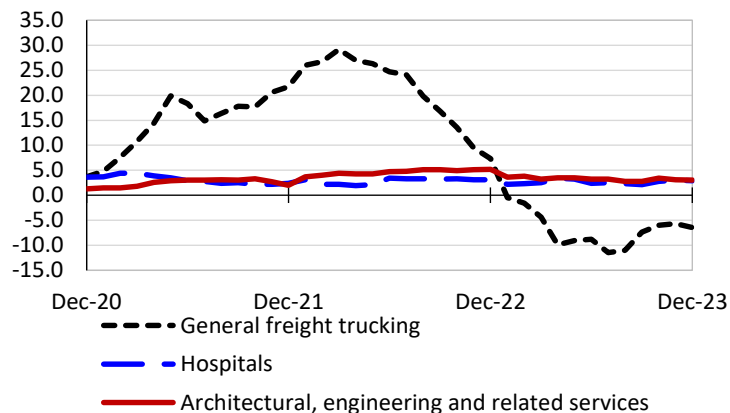
Average annual expenditures, United States and South region, 2022

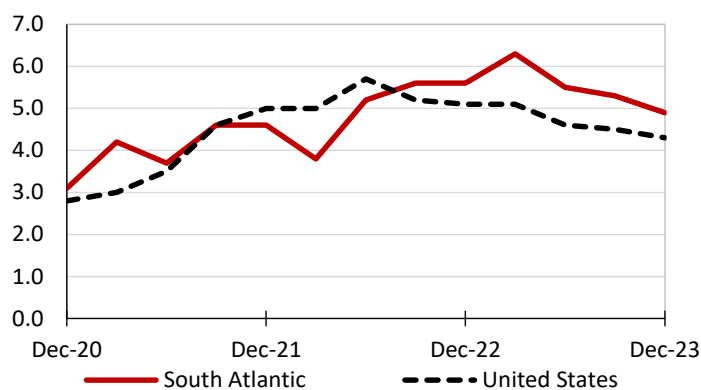
