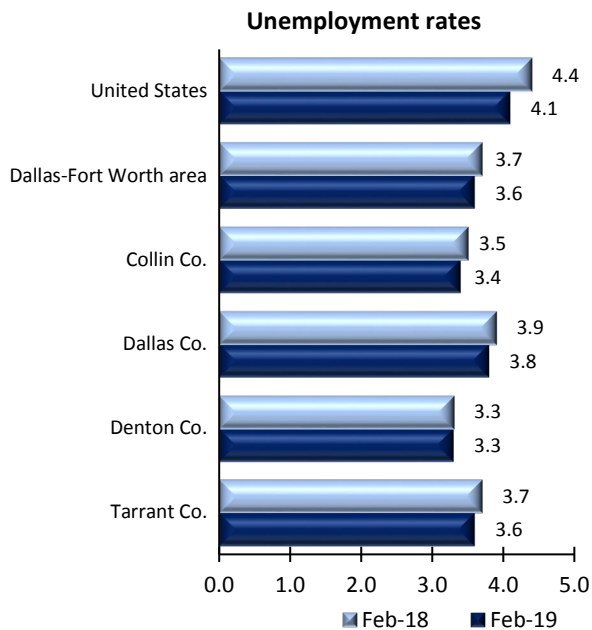


# Dallas-Fort Worth Area Economic Summary

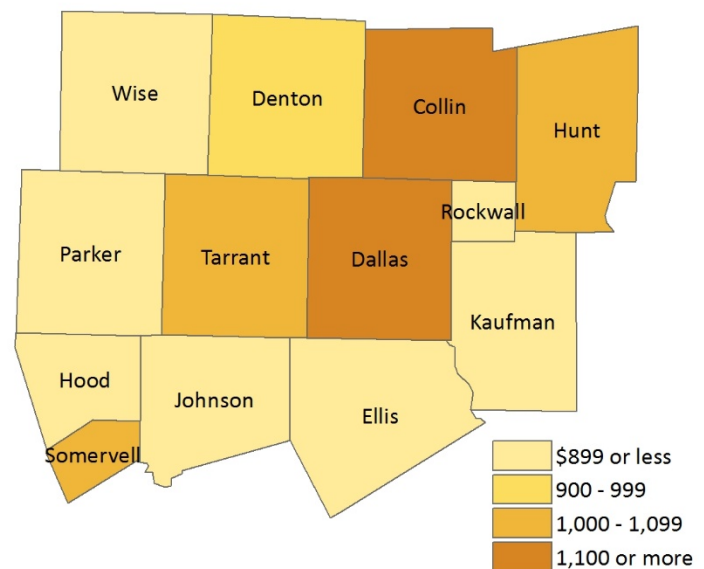
## Unemployment rates for the Dallas-Fort Worth area, selected area counties, and the nation

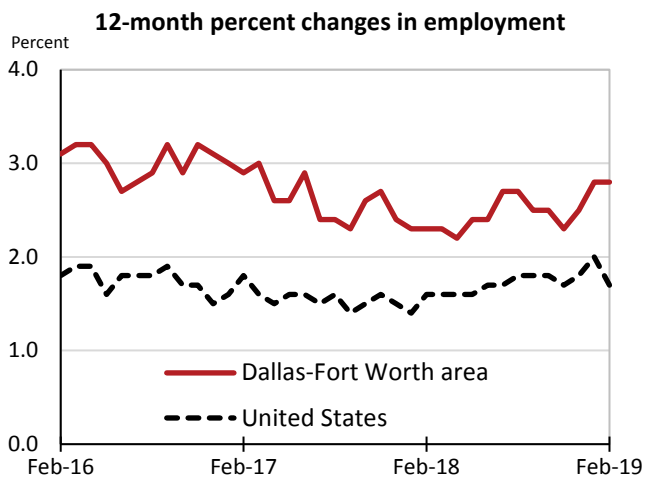
## Average weekly wages for all industries by county

## Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector



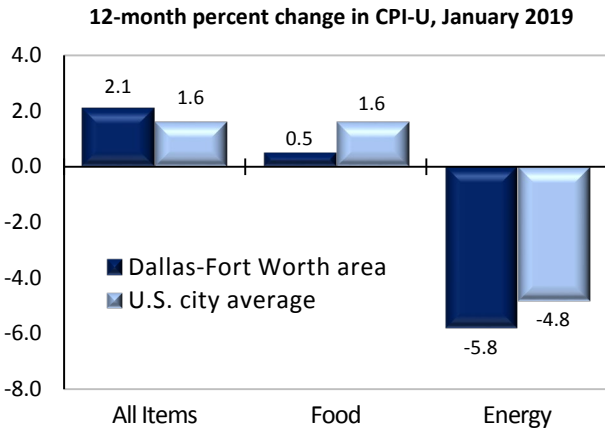

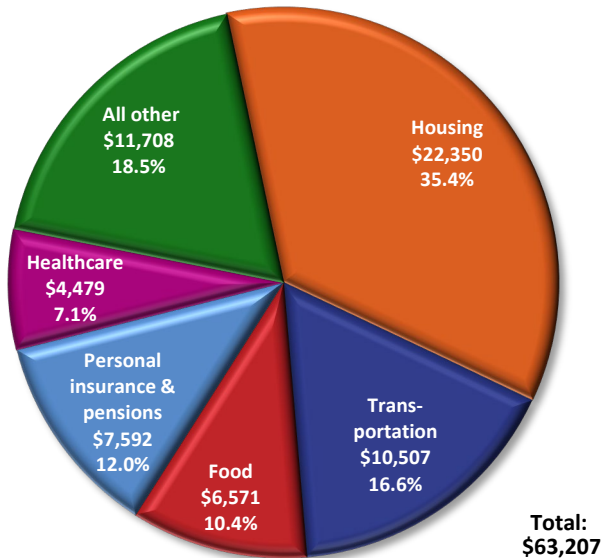
Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories

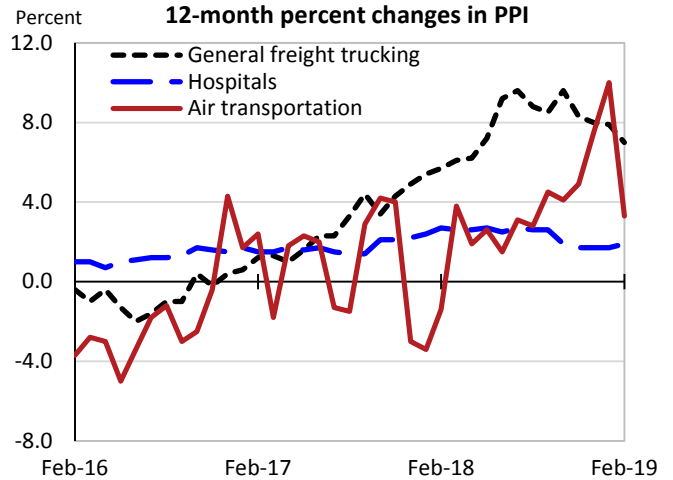
Average annual spending and percent distribution for selected categories

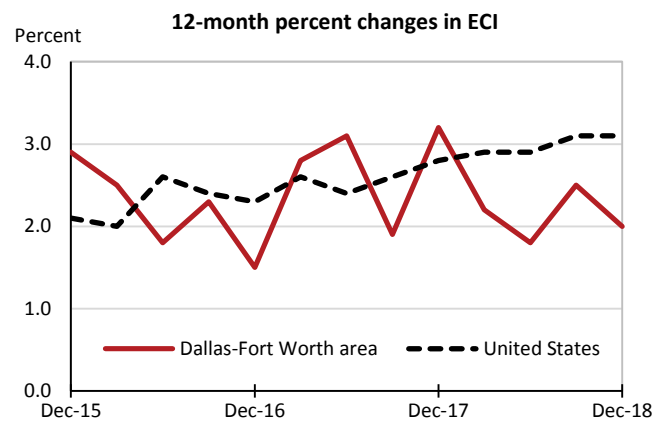
