Instructions for Reporting by Occupation

 Report employees in the occupations in which they are working, not necessarily in occupations for which they have been trained.

For example: An employee trained as an engineer, but working as a drafter, should be reported as a drafter.

- Report each employee only once in the occupation that requires the highest level
 of skill if the employee performs work in two or more occupations. If there is no
