

Explanatory note on the crosswalk from the 2000 SOC to the 2010 SOC

The crosswalk from the 2000 SOC to the 2010 SOC matches every detailed occupation from the 2000 SOC with the corresponding new 2010 SOC code(s) and title(s). A single asterisk (*) after the occupation code and title in the first column means that the occupation in the second column makes up only part of the occupation in the first column; that is, the asterisked 2000 SOC occupation has been divided into multiple new occupations. Likewise, a double asterisk (**) after the occupation code and title in the second column means that the occupation in the first column makes up only part of the occupation in the second column; that is, the double asterisked 2010 SOC occupation has been created from multiple 2000 SOC codes. Each occupation with the (*) or (**) notation appears multiple times in the chart.

For example, as shown below, the 2010 SOC occupation 11-9013 “Farmers, Ranchers, and Other Agricultural Managers**” (with two asterisks) was created from two 2000 SOC occupations: 11-9011 Farm, Ranch, and Other Agricultural Managers and 11-9012 Farmers and Ranchers. The 2000 SOC occupation; 11-9061 “Funeral Directors*” (with one asterisk) was divided into two occupations in the 2010 SOC: 11-9061 “Funeral Service Managers” and 39-4031 “Morticians, Undertakers, and Funeral Directors.”
