

## Seasonally adjusted, 1990–2020







Seasonally adjusted, 1990–2020



## **Chart 5. Nonagricultural wage and salary employment** Seasonally adjusted, 1990–2020



























## **Chart 18. Persons not in the labor force who want a job** Seasonally adjusted, 1994–2020


