



Fastest growing occupations usually requiring a bachelor's degree or more education, projected 1998-2008

Occupations usually requiring a bachelor's degree or more education are projected to be among the fastest growing between 1998 and 2008. Fast growing occupations usually have better employment prospects and more favorable conditions for mobility and advancement than do occupations with slow or declining employment.

As the chart shows, computer-related occupations lead the growth among occupations requiring a bachelor's degree or more education. Health-related occupations are also among the fastest growing—in fact, nearly half of the 20 fastest growing occupations in this education and training category are computer- or health-related. The remaining ones are from a wide range of fields, including 2 each in education, social services, and design.

These 20 occupations are expected to account for 38 percent of all new jobs in occupations requiring at least a bachelor's degree.
