Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics

What is the Occupational Employment and Wage Statistics (OEWS) program?

OEWS provides employment and wage estimates for about 830 occupations in over 400 industries. By surveying 1.1 million business establishments nationwide, OEWS produces estimates for approximately 530 metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas, the 50 states and the District of Columbia, and selected U.S. territories.

Who uses OEWS data?

- State and local workforce investment boards, as well as training professionals, use the information to determine the need for local employment, training, and educational services.
- Economic development specialists use the information to estimate available labor supply.
- Researchers use the data to understand the structure of labor markets and to understand labor costs for new markets.
- Students and counselors use the information for career planning.
- Employers and compensation specialists use the data to determine equitable and competitive pay, to develop recruiting packages, and to make site selection decisions.
- BLS and state workforce agencies use OEWS data to project employment and determine jobs in demand.

How can OEWS data help YOU?

- You can compare employment and wages across geographic areas.
- You can compare employment and wages for particular occupations across industries.
- You can compare employment and wages for different occupations.




